   POLICE DEPT. THIS INFORMATION REVEALED THAT A P-51 DID CRASH IN THIS AREA ON 26 JULY 1944 AT
   2:15 PM AFTER RECEIVING PERMISSION FROM THE FARMER TO DIG ON HIS PROPERTY. RON AND SEVERAL
  HELPERS OPENED UP A HOLE THAT MEASURED 18 FT. WIDE BY 10 FT. DEEP TO FIND THE ENGINE
   A PACKARD ROLLS ROYCE) WITH THE BENT PROP AND WHITE SPINNER STILL ATTACHED, ENOUGH OF THE
  FUSELAGE FOLLOWED THE ENGINE INTO THE SOFT GROUND TO READ THE MARKING ON THE SIDE AND FINALLY
  IDENTIFY THE PLANE AS ONE FROM THE 355th FG. MOST OF THE EXTERIOR OF THE PLANE, (THE WINGS
