Approximately 40 enemy aircraft bounced group at about 1248 to 1258, 17 to 27 minutes after bombs away, in area between above coordinates. They attacked from the tail between 5 and 8 o'clock. They came in in waves, but each of them appeared to single out an individual B-17 to attack.

Aircraft was hit by enemy aircraft and pulled off to the left. There is no more specific report.

Aircraft pulled off to left and was flying straight and level when last noticed.

Schimmel, gave the order for crew to bail out as soon as engines failed but as interphone connection was broken, none of crew heard him.
