  Two to four parachutes were seen to come cut of the airplane at intervals as the aircraft was spinning.

This was done without any signal to take over being given by the equadron leader. A/C 831 them elbed its bomb bay doors and flew in formation until it was apparently hit by flak. Due to the great confusion in this community at the time of our crash I do not believe it will be easy to gain too much information from the people. This confusion I spoke of was due to the front lines being near and the local population was moving further back into Germany.

The plane fell in a group of trees near an old castle looking building surrounded by a mote. The place is near several railroad tracks and also about 3 km. from a town. This town, I do not know the name, is about 12 km. from Herne, Germany.

If my assistance is needed I should be happy to make the trip to Germany on my own time and expense. I am sure I could identify the spot where the plane fell. My time would be well spent if in some way I could ease the minds of those mens familles here at home.
