1. A/C 42-97131 caught fire in No. 2 engine or left wing, at 1240 hours 10 miles southeast of Brandenburg, after having been hit by AAGF in the target area. Six to eight parachutes were sighted. One man was seen to fall without a parachute after it had become snagged on the left wing of the A/C.
