STATUS OF THE GROUP

1. Status of Personnel

OPERATIONAL NARRATIVE

1. Resume of Each Mission

Mission #81

BERTREVILLE ST OVEN

6 July 1944

During the period of bad weather between June 29th and July 5th the tempo of pilotless aircraft bombs falling on London has increased markedly. It was deemed necessary to use American heavy bombers in large scale attacks on their French bases in order to alleviate the destruction in this English City. Thus on this day when the R.A.F. Bomber Command could only send 550 bombers against such bases the U. S. Eighth Air Force dispatched 900 four-engined heavy bombers for this purpose in two operations.

The 157th Group was directed to supply 36 planes to make up the entire 4th "A" Combat Wing and attack the supply site at Bertreville St. Ouen. This target was one of the eight sites, identified to date, supplying pilotless aircraft components to the various launching sites in the Dunkerque/Rouen Area. The small French hamlet in which it was located lay about eight miles south of Dieppe.

The planes took off at 0636 with Col. Hoffman leading. The 5/10 clouds had no effect on the assembly and were left behind when the English Coast was crossed at Selsey Bill about two hours later. Over the Channel the three boxes took bombing interval and entered France midway between Dieppe and Fecamp. Two engines went out on Lt. Shuff's plane, lead of the high squadron in the high box. He left the formation and was followed by his two wing men. They dropped their bombs on the coastal airport of St. Valery-en-Caux and returned home.

At the I.P. the 3 boxes turned in trail for the run on the target. There were no clouds and visibility extended thirty miles. Only the lead box followed the correct track to the target. The target was extremely difficult to pick up as the few houses with their orchards and village crossroads were similar to dozens of others in the same area. Lt. Tonelli selected what he thought to be his MPI and dropped. The bombs fell a mile beyond the target.

The low and high boxes finding themselves to the left of the target, turned right and attempted a run but the distance was too short. A 360 to the left was then made and the target approached from the west instead of the south. Lt. Walls in the low box picked up what he thought was the target area and dropped. The high box came in and released at the same

place. The center of their pattern was about four miles east of the assigned aiming point.

There was no Wing rally after bombing and the boxes returned home separately. The last plane landed at 1120.

Mission #82

RENNESCOURE

6 July 1944

The second operation of the day found the 457th Group returning to the Roball Coast with 268 other Eighth Air Force heavies in the "Save London" battle.

Again the target was one of the eight known supply sites. It was located at the village of Rennescoure on the St. Omer-Hazebrouck railway five miles east of St. Omer. The 457th Group was the third of three distinct 12-plane "forces" of the 94th Wing dispatched on this target.

Take off for the 12 planes began at 1700 with Capt. Belcher -- Lt. Brackley leading the formation. The cloud conditions were unchanged from those existing on the morning mission -- England 6/10 covered and France clear. Beachy Head was left behind at 1932 on a course set for Le Treport. The I.P. was crossed in thirty minutes and Lt. Kulczyk took control of the lead plane. The target had just been hit by the "A" and "B" forces and was partially covered with smoke. In spite of this hindrance Lt. Kulczyk dropped his bombs squarely on the supply site from 25,000 feet, the second "shack" he had made in as many lead missions.

A meagre amount of flak protested mildly against the intrusion but caused no damage. The course home was flown without incident and the last plane landed at 2126.

Mission #83

LEIPZIG

7 July 1944

Our mission to the Leipzig-Taucha Aero Engine Factory on 29 June had failed to achieve the desired destruction. Therefore the plant was assigned again as the target for the 457th Group while nineteen other combat wings had the important oil refineries and aircraft factories in the Leipzig region.

Thirty-six planes began taking off at 0500 with their loads of 100 lb. incendiary bombs to form the two high boxes in the 94th "A" and "B" Combat Wings. Capt. Godfrey led the "A" box and Capt. Syptak the "B" box. The

flight took the formation due east across Holland to a point north of Magdeburg where it turned southeast to the I.P. At about this time Lt. Owens, flying an old "F" plane was unable to transfer fuel from his Tokyo tanks so he jettisoned his bombs and headed for home alone. He was only able to reach the North Sea where he had to ditch. The sea was running high and the plane broke up when it hit. Four of the crew were lost. The remainder were picked up later by Air/Sea Rescue.

The boxes in the Wings took interval for a visual run on the target. There were no clouds although some haze existed and a smoke screen had begun operation around Leipzig. The "A" box crossed the I.P. at 0947 followed thirteen minutes later by the "B" box. The lead and low boxes were ahead with their 500 lb. high explosive bombs. Lt. Vaal picked up the target but the billowing smoke hid his MPI. He put his crosshairs on the smoke and his bombs released at 0956. When Lt. Walls approached the engine factory large explosion flashes were observed and huge fires were emitting dense black smoke. He let his IB's go into the smoke as most of the buildings were obscured. No bursts from either box could be observed on the ground.

Later PRU photos showed all the main buildings had received direct hits and severely damaged. This was particularly true of the three large buildings in the open field south of the woods. One was completely destroyed and gutted by fire.

After bombing, a sharp turn to the south was made to avoid the flak guns covering the center of the city. Later when the formation turned northwest on the return route huge columns of smoke could be seen twenty to twenty-five miles away coming from the Leuna and Lutsendorf refineries and the aircraft factories at Bernburg and Aschersleben.

The route home, to the south of the great Harz Forest and Hanover, was flown without incident and the planes reached Glatton at 1300. No enemy fighters were seen, although one of the three task forces was engaged by 75 interceptors. Of the thousand planes over the targets, only 37 failed to return. Most of the refineries and aircraft factories had been severely damaged. Taucha would require no attention for a very considerable time.

Mission #84

HAUT MAISNIL
BLANCHERMENT

8 July 1944

A return was made today by the Eighth Air Force to tactical targets in northern France. Bridges, railroads and pilotless aircraft launching sites were objects of attack. The 457th Group was required to attack two of these P.A.C. sites with two 12-plane boxes. One was located in the orchards of the small rural village of Haut-Maisnil six miles below Hesdin. The other similarly hidden in orchards was five miles to the east. Both were the Belhamin type sites and probably had been spotted as being active in launching projectiles on London.

The twenty-four planes in two forces took off at 0350. No wing assembly was required and each proceeded south toward Beachy Head, the point of departure from the English Coast. Capt. Dozier, led the "A" box and Capt. Jesse Smith the "B" box. The Channel was clear but clouds were encountered as the French Coast was approached. These increased to 10/10 over the two targets and no bombing could be accomplished. The "A" box then proceeded on the return route home. The "B" box flew around in the Abbeville area on various courses looking for a target of opportunity. A break in the clouds was found over the Poix airdrome and bombs were released on this target at 0750. All the bombs fell on the field and across a runway in a concentrated pattern. Capt. Smith then led his box on a return route to Clatten. All planes in both boxes landed before 0900. The targets remained untouched.

Mission #85

HAUT MAISNIL
BLANCHERMENT

9 July 1944

A second attempt was made today to bomb the pilotless aircraft sites that had been protected by clouds the day before. The 457th Group was assigned the same targets with the same type of force as was dispatched before. This time Lt. Johnston led the "A" box on Haut Maisnil and Capt. Belcher the "B" box on Blancherment.

Take-off at 1035 was later than before. Clouds over the base caused the assembly altitude to be changed several times which delayed this operation. As a result all control points had to be cut off on the flight to North Foreland, the point of departure from the English Coast.

At the French Coast the forces separated and headed for their individual targets. An almost complete undercast prevailed over this region of France and again these sites could not be bombed. A search was

made for targets of opportunity but the clouds hid everything. The planes therefore took up a heading for England.

Over the Channel the weather had closed in completely. Prefrontal clouds existed from 2,000 feet altitude to 20,000 feet and it was raining. The visibility was only three miles. Back at Glatton the clouds extended down to 800 feet. A diversion message was sent out. The planes landed at other fields less closed in and returned to Glatton later that day after the weather cleared.

Mission #86

MUNICH

11 July 1944

Munich, in addition to being the fourth largest city in Germany, had become a center of development for jet propelled aircraft. Experimental stations, factories for assembly and fuels, and operational fields were located at nearby Leipheim, Schwabisch-Hall, Friedrichshafen, and Lechfeld. Intelligence reports indicated early use of this plane against American heavy bomber formations. It also contained the parent BMW aero engine factory, Allach.

All of Western Europe was overcast and the city presented the right kind of target to be located by PFF means. Twelve hundred heavy bombers were dispatched in a vast operation to hit this center of production. The 457th Group was directed to attack Allach if visual conditions existed and the center of Munich if the expected 10/10 undercast prevailed.

Thirty-six planes took off at 0730 in the morning to make up the lead and low boxes of the 94th "B" Combat Wing. Major Smith led the formation in a PFF plane while Capt. Lady led the low box. Clouds interfered somewhat with the assembly and the routing over England. Enroute to Felixstowe, Lt. Gazzale's left wing tip caught fire and the crew began bailing out. The plane then blew up and the pilot was blown out of the plane. He parachuted safely to earth with five of his crew. Three were killed.

The redistribution of anti-aircraft guns north of Paris had closed the old well-worn route to Southern Germany. The guns had to be avoided so the route took the formation across the North Sea to the Scheldt Islands and thence due south to the west of Brussels, before a turn toward Munich was made at the Northern French border. A complete undercast existed from there to Munich. The heavy concentration of enemy single engine fighters in the Paris region refused to be airborne and give battle. American fighters were present in large numbers and waiting for them.

The PFF equipment on Major Smith's ship went out so Capt. Hoelzer took over with the deputy lead PFF plane and led the formation into south Germany. Near the I.P., Donauworth, his equipment failed also. The two PFF planes in the leading 9th "A" Wing were not working well so a 360 degree turn was made in order to bring the formation in behind trailing wings for bombing on their more accurately placed smoke markers. As the formation neared the city the equipment on Capt. Hoelzer's plane came back in very faintly and the wing dropped the bombs on this plane at 1236 from 27,000 feet. Only a moderate amount of flak came up through the dense undercast and it was thousands of feet from the formation. No planes received even one hit.

On the way home the enemy fighters still remained on the ground, although one thousand fifty heavy bombers had dropped 2,350 tons of bombs on Munich. The formation broke up over the North Sea and the planes of the 457th Group reached Glatton at 1700. Only twenty-four of the 1050 attacking force failed to return.

Mission #87

MUNICH

12 July 1944

Heavy cloudy weather still persisted over all of enemy occupied Europe. Visual missions on strategic and tactical targets were impossible. Munich still remained the logical target for a PFF attack. Twelve hundred seventy Eighth Air Force heavies were dispatched in today's operation on this hub of aerial and transportation activity. Again the 457th Group furnished thirty-six B-17's to form the lead and low boxes of the 9th "B" Combat Wing. Major Spencer - Lt. Stafford led the Wing in a PFF plane while Capt. Reilly led the low box.

Take off at 0905 was into a cloud filled sky which probably was the cause of Polebrook not effecting Wing assembly until the formation had reached Felixstowe. The penetration route was exactly the same as the mission the day before. Again French based enemy fighters chose to remain on the ground. Enroute to Munich an occasional break in the clouds revealed landmarks on the ground. From the I.P. a normal run was made into the city with no malfunctions. When the flak belt around the city was pierced the fire was more accurate than before. Lt. Kerr's plane fell back with #1 engine smoking and prop feathered presumably a casualty to flak. He was not seen again. Two planes in the lead box had forced the low box out of position on the bomb run so that it was trailing considerably before bombs away. The lead box approached from the northwest to the right of the center of the city and released its bombs by PFF. A hole in the clouds revealed the Badern suburbs to be directly below. Although

clouds obscured the ground from that point a plotting of the bomb fall placed them in the Ober Sendling industrial and residential district three miles south of the center of the center of Munich. The low box, was unable to see the bombs released in the lead box and failed to drop. Accurate flak persisted as the formation crossed the area. Lt. Kosel's plane was observed to have lost its #1 propeller and lagged. It headed for Switzerland. Lt. Kaufman's plane was hit by flak but he made it back as far as the English Channel where the crew bailed out and were picked up by Air Sea Rescue. Thirty-five minutes after leaving Munich a hole in the clouds revealed the small German town of Ingstingen and the low box aimed its bombs at this target. They were scattered over a wide area. The remainder of the route was flown without incident and the enemy coast was crossed at 1636. The planes reached Clatten an hour later.

Eleven hundred fifty planes had dropped 2,766 tons of high explosive and incendiary bombs on Munich for a loss of 26 planes, eight of which went to Switzerland. Although it was impossible to tell where the main weight of the bombs fell, photos taken through the 9-10/10 undercast indicated they landed in the center of the city rather than the outlying suburbs.

EVENTS and ANNOUNCEMENTS

All personnel of this Station were invited to attend the Garden Fete sponsored by the British Red Cross at Conington Castle on 1 July. The fete began at 1430 hours and a dance at the Officers' Mess at 2100 hours climaxed the gaiety for the evening. The Station Band, "The Fireballs", under the direction of Sgt. Phil Falappino provided the music. All proceeds went to the British Red Cross.

It was announced on 4 July that all personnel of this Bomb Group - ground and air echelons - were now eligible to wear the Bronze Star on the ETO ribbon. Up to the present writing this applied to bomb squadrons only. Information as to personnel of other units was expected to be forthcoming at a later date.

In connection with the above award the following commendation by the commanding officer of the group was published on 6 July:

"The Commanding Officer again desires to commend the ground personnel of this station, particularly those men engaged in the grueling work of maintaining and loading combat aircraft. The superior bombing record of the 457th Bombardment Group for the past few weeks would not have been possible without the whole-hearted and efficient effort of all ground personnel of the station. Even though that effort may seem less glamorous than actual combat duty, it is nevertheless all important. The Commanding Officer desires to point out that the award of the Bronze Star is available to those crew chiefs who continue, as they have been doing, to distinguish themselves. The performance of the station as a whole has been a job that every officer and enlisted man of Station 130 and the 457th can be proud of. We've got it now, men - keep up the good work!"

On 7 July, by arrangement of Special Services, personnel of this station enjoyed a swim at the Phorpres Club pool. Transportation left the station theater at 1500 hours and brought the swimmers back at 1700 hours. On 10 July it was announced that these swims would become a regular feature in this station's recreation program. Trucks now depart for the pool every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 1500 hours.

The U. S. O. show, "Music on the March," was presented at the Aero Club Tuesday, 11 July. There were two showings, at 1900 and 2100 hours.

Both officers and enlisted men were entertained on 13 July by a CEMA (Culture and Enlightenment of Musical Arts) concert. There were two performances - the first at 2000 hours at the Aero Club, and at 2100 hours at the Officers' Club.

With the publication of the following Memorandum (Hq. 1 B.D.), dated 11 July 1944; on 13 July, the personnel of the 457th were informed of the important part they played on D-Day as members of the First Division:

"I am in receipt of a letter from a senior member of the Allied Combined Chiefs of Staff concerning the operations of this Division on D-Day. The following is a quotation from this letter and will be brought to the attention of the personnel under your command.

'An outstanding impression of my entire trip to the European Theater was the remarkable show on D-Day, wherein your entire very large force moved with excellent timing and bombed objectives with instruments which they had never seen, without so much as scratching the paint on a rowboat in the squirming Channel below. That amazing display of scientific and training achievement was most impressive. I have described it to the Commanding General of Second Air Force in glowing terms as an end result of the training effort in that organization.'

-Signed ROBERT B. WILLIAMS, Major General, USA, Commanding."

A change was announced also on 13 July in the Liberty Run schedule for swimmers. Trucks were now to leave this station at 1800 hours and leave the Phorpree Club at 2030 hours.

Unfortunately, there seemed to be a lack of interest in swimming among the men and the run was cancelled the next day.

All Catholic and other interested personnel were invited to attend a Catholic mission held each evening during the week of 16 July. The mission was conducted by Father Owen Dudley in the Chapel at 1st Bomb Division Headquarters at 1900 hours. Transportation was furnished for all desiring to attend and left from the station theater at 1830 hours.

On 23 July it was brought to the attention of ground personnel that they may now take passes of 24-hour duration involving travel of more than 25 miles.

Musical lovers of this station enjoyed the opportunity of listening to the London Philharmonic Orchestra under the direction of Dr. Heinz Unger on 26 July. Special Services arranged for transportation to Peterborough Cathedral where the concert was held.

On the last day of the month, the group's activities in the air were brought dramatically into the limelight by publication of the following notice:

COMBINATION. Ltr Hq. USSAF, dated 21 July 1944, is quoted -

"1. I have now received photographs of Munich which illustrate the damage caused by attacks of the Eighth Air Force on 11, 12, 13, 16 and 19 July.

2. These photographs clearly show that great damage has been contained in this target area and that included in this damage are direct hits on Bayerische Motoren Werke, the Agfa Dye Works, the main railroad station, a large oil depot and other important installations. These attacks have undoubtedly been severe blows to German war production. They have again shown the people of Munich and all Germany the effective striking power of our Air Forces.

3. I wish to congratulate the crews that participated in these attacks and those responsible for their excellent training in PFF technique which has led to the highly successful operational application of this method in the recent attacks on the Munich area. These missions called for great endurance while flying under difficult conditions. They will result in directly affecting Germany's ability to continue the war."

RECREATION AND WELFARE

1. Special Services

These men will attend a 3-day schooling course in London to better acquaint themselves with this program. 1st Lt. Wm. G. The athletic program has progressed very rapidly, with two station softball leagues having played approximately 27 games during the past month. The end of the month had the 468th Sub-Depot leading the American League, while the 860th Chemical Co. led the National League. The Station Softball team continued their losing streak by dropping two more league games, but the close of the season saw the team rounding into possible contenders for the 1st Division crown. The Station Baseball team dropped 2 league games, while winning one, to approximately hold their same standing in the Division League. All other activities showed an increase in participation.

2. Station Band

One of the station's most popular morale boosters is the band, officially known as the "Fireballs". Under the able direction of Sgt. Phil Palappine, who also doubles as vocalist, the boys have gained much acclaim in the surrounding communities as well as here at our station.

The regular engagements of the band consist of the enlisted men's dances held on alternate Fridays and the Officers' and NCO parties. One of the most memorable events in the collective opinion of the "Fireballs" occurred on the night of 3 July when they played a dance engagement at St. Ives. Their hep-cat jive and smooth, soothing rhythm literally swayed the crowd into near frenzy. Even the girls began to sigh and get that swooning look when Sgt. Palappine let loose with the vocal strain.

As for the future, it is the band's ardent hope to be able to "get another sax man" into the happy family.

3. American Red Cross

The Red Cross case work for the station was for the most part the routine type except for a few instances where men of the organization here have received word of a brother or other relative based in one of the hospitals here in England due to being wounded in action in France.

During the month there have been 29 various entertainment functions held in the Club. And there have been served over the Snack Bar a total of 33,475 snacks exclusive of coffee, tea, and cokes. Also during the month the Red Cross served approximately 7500 snacks to the missions.

STORIES OF THE MONTH

Award of the Silver Star was made on 2 July to GEORGE C. HOZIER, Commanding Officer of the 748th Bombardment Squadron, Major, Army Air Forces, United States Army for gallantry in action, while leading a Combat Wing of B-17 airplanes on a bombardment mission over Germany, 28 May 1944. Prior to reaching the target, a large force of enemy fighters attacked viciously and succeeded in severely damaging Major Hozier's aircraft. One engine was damaged and set afire and the wing fuel tank punctured, seriously endangering the safety of his aircraft. Determined to accomplish the mission, Major Hozier, in spite of the damaged condition of his plane, maintained the lead position and maneuvered the wing over the assigned objective. When it was found impossible to visually bomb this objective because of cloud and dense smoke, Major Hozier, after two vain attempts, led his wing to the secondary target and bombed it with excellent results. His gallant leadership, sound judgment and devotion to duty were largely responsible for the success achieved by the units under his command. Major Hozier entered military service from Tennessee.

A former member of this group, Technical Sergeant Paul A. Birchen, son of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Birchen, of Hastings, Minnesota, has also been decorated with the Silver Star, it was recently announced by the commanding general, Eighth Air Force.

The Silver Star was presented to Sergeant Birchen for his heroism and devotion to duty, while participating in one of the huge daylight bombing assaults of the Eighth Air Force, against Nazi Europe.

While on the way to bomb an enemy airfield in France, the B-17 Flying Fortress on which Birchen was serving as a top turret gunner-engineer received a series of savage enemy fighter attacks. As a result of this action one of the engines of the Fort was completely destroyed, a second damaged, and the instruments and electrical system were rendered inoperative. However, determined to complete their mission, the crew decided to continue on. Just prior to reaching the target area, the formation was subjected to a terrific anti-aircraft barrage. Birchen's Fort received a direct hit immediately behind the pilot's compartment. Flak fragments destroyed the rudder control cables, the oxygen storage tanks were punctured and the junction box to the electrical system was demolished. Instantly a terrific fire broke out. The pilot ordered the crew to bail out, but none of them could as all

exits of escape were barred by the wreckage within the ship. Sergeant Birchen turned his attentions to the raging fire, and with utter disregard for his own personal safety began throwing out burning flares and oxygen tanks, and beating the flames out with his flak suit. He finally collapsed from the lack of oxygen. Upon being revived he continued to fight the blaze until he completely extinguished it. He then repaired some of the damage to the rudder control cable, which made it possible for the Fortress to land safely.

Sergeant Birchen's actions during this entire mission inspired his comrades and in a large measure contributed to their safe return.

A week later Sergeant Birchen was participating in another mission, when a direct hit wounded him in the head. He is now in the zone of the interior and well on the way to complete recovery, and has been decorated again, this time with the Purple Heart.

During one of the recent daylight bombing assaults of the Eighth Air Force against the Nazi war machine, the B-17 Flying Fortress commanded by First Lieutenant Charles C. Canfield, pilot, of 1328 S. 26th St., St. Joseph, Mo., was so badly riddled with flak that it had to be turned back towards England before reaching its target. Two engines were completely shot out as the big ship limped through the sky over Germany to the North Sea. A fire broke out in the oxygen system just below the co-pilot's compartment, which Technical Sergeant Cain, the top turret gunner-engineer, of Murrayville, Ill., extinguished by using his bare hands and some of the damaged fire-fighting equipment. The ship was over the North Sea when a third engine failed. Canfield told the crew to prepare to ditch. The crew took their positions in the radio room, and Lt. Canfield and Lt. Clarence E. Ross, the co-pilot, of Franklin, Nebraska, set the big ship down in the North Sea. Utilizing the knowledge gained from previous training and adding a little of their own ingenuity, the entire crew made their way out of the Fort and into their rubber dingys. The plane had broken in two and sank twenty-five seconds after hitting the water. Lt. Warren Suddeth, the bombardier-navigator, of Toledo, Ohio, said, "I didn't know how to swim when we hit the water, but I sure learned how fast."

Two U. S. fighter planes, P-51 Mustangs, hovered overhead until they could see that things on the water were okay, and they then proceeded on their way after radioing the position of the bomber's crew.

The Fortress's crew was unable to use their radio in the dinky,

lest the enemy pick up their message, since they were only fifteen miles off the German coast.

About three hours elapsed when a British Air Sea Rescue plane appeared and dropped a power boat to the stranded crew. At the same time a fishing ship appeared and took the bomber's crew aboard. The ship was a Danish fishing craft, and the skipper, in broken English, told the American airmen that he would take them to England. As a matter of fact, he insisted on taking them back to Britain. They started out for the English coast with Lt. Suddath aiding in the navigation of the ship.

Realizing as they neared British waters, that there was a great danger of hitting mines, Lt. Ross and Sergeant Cain left the fishing craft in the power boat. They hoped to reach the coast and arrange for the Danish craft to make harbor safely. As Ross and Cain neared the coast, they were observed by a plane of the British Air Sea Rescue, which radioed for a launch to pick up the two airmen. Another aircraft sighted the fishing ship and arranged for her safe passage into an English Port.

Lt. Canfield and his crew are back at their home station, well rested and eager to return to their work of blasting Nazi Germany and occupied Europe.

It is particularly objectionable as it involves the possibility of serious injury or death of military and postal personnel and damage to government property.

3. All commands will take positive action to see that all military personnel and civilians using the Army Postal Service are advised of the statutory provisions regarding the mailing of explosives. Parcels found upon examination by unit or base censors to contain explosives will be condemned. Army postal personnel accepting parcels for mailing will require mailers to state specifically the contents of parcels and will refuse to accept parcels containing unmailable articles." *gms*
