2. Crews Missing in Action

10 April 1945

749th Squadron

Oranienburg, Germany

Three to four Me-262's attacked the group from the tail just after the turn off the target. No flak was encountered. A slit four or five feet long and parallel to the air vents (Louvers) was torn in the top of the left wing. The slit was two or three feet ahead of the air vents and between number 1 and number 2 engines, but closer to number 1 engine. There was a glowing fire visible inside the wing through this slit. Smoke was seen to come from this part of the wing as the A/C left the formation. The smoke did not appear to increase but rather to decrease as the A/C got farther away. A/C #44-8368 was under control until about 10 miles from the formation. Up to that point it had been heading in an easterly direction. It then began to circle to the left back toward the formation. It had completed about half a circle when it suddenly went into a spin smoking heavily, and blew up either in the air or on hitting the ground. No parachutes were seen.

10 April 1945

748th Squadron

Oranienburg, Germany

Three to four Me-262's attacked the group from the tail at 1145 hours just after the turn off the target. One attacked A/C #43-38606. No flak was encountered. When A/C 606 was attacked, it immediately nosed over and went straight down. No damage to the aircraft was seen as it left the formation. After it had fallen for some distance, it burst into flames, one wing came off and the rest of the ship exploded at 15,000 feet. Zero to two chutes were seen. No one was seen bailing out. The two chutes that were reported were said to have opened at a very low altitude.

Meagre inaccurate flak was encountered in vicinity of I.P. at 1729-1207. Number 4 engine of A/C #44-8557 was smoking. Aircraft was not out of control. At 1428 hours, about 2 minutes after the group had encountered flak in the vicinity of the I.P., and while at 1737-1218E on the bomb run to the number 1 target (Traunstein), A/C 557 jettisoned its waist door. Then four to six chutes were seen to come from the A/C. After the chutes had come from the A/C, it peeled off to the left in a 180 degree turn, dropped its bombs and closed its bomb bay doors.

Mission #205

KASSEL

9 March 1945

Assembly was on the Glatton Bunker at 7,000 feet as briefed.

The Group swung five miles north of course at Crowland. The Flux gate compass was erratic until after leaving England. The remainder of the route was flown approximately as briefed except that Norwich was cut off in order to gain time. Wing Assembly was accomplished without difficulty.

Control Point #1 was reached two minutes late and five miles north of course. The Group was in proper position at the head of the Division column. Division assembly line was flown slightly left of course.

Route over the Continent was uneventful and was flown as briefed. The Air Commander was notified by the weather scouting force that the target area was open. Interval was taken by the Group with squadrons in trail.

The I.P. was crossed on course by all three squadrons. The Lead Squadron was 400 feet below briefed altitude so that in the event that the squadron had to bomb by Gee H equipment an absolute altitude of 24,000 feet would be attained without radical adjustments on the run. Each squadron performed its own visual sighting operation. The bombardiers were able to identify the general target area at the I.P., but ground haze and smoke prevented identification of the MPI until about three minutes before the H.R.L. C-1 Pilot functioned normally for all squadrons, and the mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1006½ from 24,600 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be very good.

Group rally was accomplished without difficulty and the formation proceeded on the return route. Course was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #206

HANAU

10 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 14,000 feet as briefed.

The route over England was flown approximately as briefed. The Group assembled in Wing formation behind the 94th "B" Group. Prior to reaching Control Point #1, it was necessary for the Group to deviate off course because the 94th "A" Group, which was apparently late, had cut in, in front of Polesbrook, forcing them and us right.

Control Point #1 was not crossed on course for reasons mentioned above. Division Assembly line was flown to the right of course in order to avoid "prop wash" and to maintain a sufficient interval behind and to the right of Wing formation. The Group was in proper position in numerical order, but was off to the right of the Division Column.

Over the Zuider Zee there was sufficient interval to permit the Group to swing back on course and in trail of the 351st Group. Flight to the target was flown approximately on course except that the Group swung purposely wide of the I.P. in order to prepare for a Gee H run on the primary target.

Cloud coverage was 10/10ths and a Gee H run was begun on the primary target. About half way down the run Gee H equipment went out and the lead was turned over to "Mickey" operator. A run was then made on the secondary target. C-1 Pilot functioned normally, and the mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1317½ from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were unknown due to 10/10ths cloud coverage at target.

The Group reassembled in Division column and flew the return route on the briefed course. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #207

BRAZEN

11 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 9,000 feet, as briefed. No difficulties were encountered.

The route over England was flown approximately as briefed except that it was necessary to deviate slightly to the left of course because "Swordfish" crossed in front of the formation.

Control Point #1 was reached on time, on course, and in proper position in Division formation. Division Assembly Line was flown slightly to the left of course, in trail of the Division formation.

The route to the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed except for slight deviations in course in order to remain in Division formation. The scouting force reported 10/10ths undercast in the target area.

Bombing was done in Group formation, by means of PFF equipment. The lead squadron lead A/C performed the sighting operation, with all three squadrons releasing their bombs on the smoke marker of the lead A/C. C-1 Pilot functioned normally for the lead and low squadrons, but the AFCE of the high squadron lead became inoperative about half way down the run. The 500 lb GP's were dropped at 1328 from 26,300 feet.

Bomb results were unobserved due to clouds.

After bombing, the Group rallied with the Division column and proceeded on the return route. The Group was staggered slightly out to the left over enemy territory in order to avoid "prop-wash." The flight was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was begun and continued until the Group reached the Glatton Bunker. There, an instrument let-down was made and the A/C landed without incident.

Mission #208

GRENZMUNDE

12 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 8,500 feet, as briefed. No difficulties were encountered.

The Group assembled in Wing Formation with little difficulty. Route over England was flown north of course in trail of Wing Leader.

Control Point #1 was reached on course one minute early but in proper position in Division formation. Division Assembly Line was flown approximately as briefed. The Group kept drifting right of course in Division column.

Over the North Sea, the Division column executed an approximate 90 degree turn to the right in order to get behind the 3rd Division, which was to the left of the formation. The 457th followed the Division column. After crossing the Danish coast, it was necessary to execute two double-drifts to avoid overrunning the preceding groups. As a result of this, the Group was approximately twenty miles north of the briefed I.P.

Cloud coverage at the target area was 10/10ths. Bombing was done by PFF equipment. Each individual squadron performed its own sighting operation. AFCE equipment functioned normally for all three squadrons. No difficulties were encountered.

The Group rallied without incident and rejoined the Division column. The route was flown approximately as briefed, except for slight deviations in order to stay in Division formation. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further difficulty.

Mission #209

LOHNE

14 March 1945

Assembly was on the Glatton Bunker at 6,000 feet as briefed; no difficulties were encountered with assembly.

Course over England was flown approximately as briefed, with the following exceptions: The Group left the Bunker five minutes early and swung about four to five miles left of course in order to assemble in Wing formation behind the 94th "B" Group. In between Redhill and Beachy Head, the Group again went left of course to avoid prop wash from the preceding group and also because another formation was coming in from the right.

As a result of conditions mentioned above, Beachy Head was reached left of course but in proper position in Division formation. Control Point #1 was reached on time, on course.

Flight to the I.P. was uneventful. Course was flown as briefed except for considerable "S'ing" and the execution of numerous double-drifts in order to stay in Division formation. The I.P. was reached on course. Gee-H equipment on the lead A/C became inoperative and lead was turned over to the deputy just before the I.P.

Bombing was done visually, with squadrons in trail. The lead and low squadrons made a normal visual run. Visibility was about five miles. The MPI was located by both squadrons about five miles before the HRL. Some difficulty was encountered in locating the MPI because of ground haze. The right rack of the lead ship in the lead squadron hung up at the HRL. By the time the high squadron began the run on the target, smoke caused by bombs of the squadron ahead and ground haze obscured the MPI and made it virtually impossible for the Bombardier to identify. In accordance with 1 A.D. Field Order #656, Section 3, par. F, sub-par. (3), the Bombardier selected an aiming point in the Marshalling Yards that was not obscured. C-1 Pilot functioned without difficulty for all three squadrons, and the mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1522½ from 23,100 feet.

Bomb results of the three squadrons ranged from fair to good.

After bombing, the group rally was accomplished without incident and the formation reassembled in Division column. The route was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base.

Mission #210

ZOSSEN

15 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 5,000 feet as briefed; no difficulty was encountered.

Route over England was flown slightly left of course. Wing Assembly was accomplished without incident. On the approach to Control Point #1, it was necessary to deviate to the left of course in order to assure proper position in Division column.

Control Point #1 was reached about four miles left of course and one minute late but in proper position in Division formation. Division Assembly line was flown left of course in trail of Division column.

Course over the continent was flown approximately as briefed. Slight deviations to the right and left of course were necessary in order to stay in Division formation. Scouting Force advised the formation that there was a considerable amount of haze at the target and a few clouds.

Accordingly, a visual run was made on the No. 1 target, in squadron formation. None of the three squadrons was able to identify the MPI because of very dense ground haze and intense smoke and fires caused by the bombing done by preceding groups. The lead and low squadrons released in the smoke and fires. The high squadron sighted on the Group Lead's smoke markers and smoke in the general target area. Visibility was poor aloft. The mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1445½ from 22,000 feet.

Observed bomb results were poor.

Rally was accomplished without difficulty. Course from the target was flown as briefed except for deviations to the right of course about thirty minutes

before reaching Control Point #4, in order to remain in Division column. The remainder of the route was uneventful. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #211

ALTBURG

17 March 1945

Assembly was on the Glatton Bunker at 7,500 feet as briefed; no difficulty was encountered.

Course was flown approximately as briefed. The Group assembled in Wing formation without incident. The formation swung out a little to the right of course on the approach to Beachy Head.

Beachy Head, the first point on the Division Assembly Line, was reached on time, on course, and in proper position in Division formation. Division Assembly Line was flown as briefed.

Route to the I.P. was flown in trail of the Division Leader and was flown approximately as briefed. Deviations to the left of course were necessary in order to remain in Division formation. As the Group approached the I.P., the PTF equipment on the lead aircraft became inoperative and it was necessary to turn the lead over to the deputy.

The Group went to briefed altitude plus 800 feet, in order to avoid clouds and contrails. Cloud coverage in the target area varied from 0/10ths to 10/10ths. Bombing was done in Group formation by means of PTF equipment. Some difficulty was encountered when an unidentified group crossed in front of the formation on the bomb run. G-1 functioned normally. The run was made on the No. 2 target, and the mixed load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1243 from 27,700 feet.

Strike photos of bomb results show nothing but clouds.

After bombing, the Group lead aircraft again took over the lead and proceeded on the return route. A complete failure of navigational aids caused the Group to deviate twenty to thirty miles right of the briefed course. About ten to fifteen minutes after the target, the lead was turned over to the high squadron leader. After a short interval, the Group turned to the left in order to get back on the briefed course. Remainder of the route was flown about as briefed, except that no Division or Wing rally was accomplished. A normal let-down was made. Eleven aircraft landed in France and the remainder returned to base.

Mission #212

BERLIN

18 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 9,000 feet; no difficulty was encountered.

The Group assembled in Wing formation without difficulty and followed in trail for the remainder of the route. On the turn before Control Point #1, the Group swung out wide to the left of course, in order to gain more interval behind the Wing Leader.

Control Point #1 was reached about five miles left of course but in proper position in Division formation. Deviations to the north of course along the Division Assembly Line was necessary in order to remain in Division column.

Course to the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed. Slight deviations were necessary in order to stay in Division formation. The Scouting Force reported that instrument bombing with a visual assist was possible.

The I.P. was crossed about fifteen miles left of course in order to avoid interference from other groups on the bomb run. Contrails and clouds caused constant interference along the run. The high flight of the low squadron was attacked by Me-262's. This element was out of position to the left of the Group formation. Bombing was done in Group formation by means of a combination PFF and visual assist. Cloud coverage was from 4/10ths to 5/10ths; visibility was poor. The high squadron bombed to the right of the Group formation instead of to the left, because a squadron from another group prevented the A/C from crossing over to their proper position. AFCS functioned normally for the low and lead squadrons, but the high squadron had to make a manual run. Some difficulty was also experienced from heavy prop wash at the BRL. The mixed bomb load of GP's and H's were dropped at 1122 from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be fair.

After bombing, the Group was unable to sight the "Woodcraft Able" Leader because of dense and persistent contrails. Because of the possibility of imminent E/A attacks, the Group Leader decided to rejoin the Division Bomber Stream without regard to position. Return route was flown left of course in Division Column. Shortly after crossing Control Point #4, the formation came back on course and flew the remainder of the course approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group landed without further incident.

Mission #213

FULDA-PLAUE

19 March 1945

The Group took off and flew to the assembly area without difficulty. The formation then assembled over A-39 at 11,000 feet as briefed.

Assembly Course was flown approximately as briefed. The Group left the A-39 Bunker 1½ minutes early. Wing Assembly was accomplished without incident.

Control Point #1 was reached a little early, slightly right of course but in proper position in Division column. Deviations to the right of course along the Division Assembly Line were necessary in order to follow the Division Bomber stream. The Group had to climb to briefed altitude, plus 1,500 feet along the line in order to avoid weather conditions.

After the Group crossed Control Point #1, weather conditions became increasingly more difficult. Haze and dense, persistent contrails above 15,000 feet caused constant interference. Accordingly, the formation climbed to 26,000 feet (briefed, plus 1,500) in order to get above existing weather conditions. Weather in the area of Molbis prevented bombing visually. The Group

was forced to execute a 360 degree turn to the right on the last leg before the I.P. because contrails and three groups coming from the left had crowded the Group off course. The high squadron became separated from the Group at this point.

The PFF Operator was unable to pick up the #2 and #3 targets. A run was then attempted on Saalfeld, but just before the HRL, another group passed beneath the Group preventing the lead and low squadrons from releasing their bombs. The PFF Operator then stated that he could pick up Fulda. As the two squadrons approached the target, weather conditions had cleared sufficiently to allow the formation to let down to 24,700 feet. A visual run was made on this target, with squadrons in trail. Results were good. AFCE functioned normally. The high squadron, after having become separated from the other two squadrons, made a PFF run on the secondary target. Bombing was done from an altitude of 28,000 feet because of cirrus clouds, contrails and haze. Cloud coverage was 10/10ths. C-1 Pilot functioned normally and no other difficulties were encountered.

The lead and low squadrons accomplished Group rally and followed the approximate briefed course. After having crossed friendly lines, the Air Commander gave permission to aircraft low on fuel to land on the continent. Twenty-one A/C landed on the continent for refueling. The high squadron proceeded out individually. High squadron leader also gave permission for aircraft low on fuel to land on the continent. Eleven aircraft landed there.

Mission #21:

HOPSTEN-ACHMER

21 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 13,000 feet as briefed.

Course over England was flown slightly right of course and Point "D" was cut short in order to arrive at Control Point #1 on time. Combat Wing was formed without difficulty.

Control Point #1 was reached on time, on course, and in proper position in Division formation. Division Assembly Line was flown approximately as briefed.

Route to the I.P. was flown on time, on course. Weather Scouting Force reported the target area clear, and it was decided to make a run on the primary target. Squadrons took interval and prepared for a visual run.

A run was begun on the No. 1 target (Hopsten A/F) but dense, persistent contrails obscured the target from the Bombardier, and bombs were not released. Low and high squadrons followed the leader and did not release their bombs at this time. The Group then proceeded to the No. 2 target but contrails again obscured the target from the lead Bombardier. The low squadron, however, was able to make a visual run on this target. The aiming point was changed to the intersection of the runways. Just before the run on the secondary, the high squadron lead was hit by AA/GF and it was necessary to turn the lead over to the deputy. The lead and high squadrons then executed a wide 360 degree turn, selected a new initial point and proceeded to make a second run on the primary target. High

[REDACTED]

squadron deputy was hit by AAGF and dropped out of formation. The high squadron leader then reassumed the lead, though it was crippled by AAGF and it was necessary to release bombs on those of the Group lead squadron. The lead and low squadrons experienced some difficulty with AFCE. The lead and high squadrons let down to 2,000 feet below briefed altitude to avoid contrails on the second run.

Bomb results were observed to be fair for the low squadron, and good for the lead and high squadrons.

The low squadron proceeded to base alone. Route was uneventful and was approximately as briefed. The lead and high squadrons, after bombing, cut off the first briefed turn off the target, in order to gain time. The formation came back on course at the briefed I.P. and followed the approximate briefed track home. A normal let-down was made and the Group landed without incident.

Mission #215

BARNINGHOLMEN

22 March 1945

Assembly was on the Glatton Bunker at 15,000 feet as briefed.

Assembled behind the 94th "B" Group at Crowland and followed the Wing formation to Control Point #1. The Wing formation was right of course between Crowland and Point "D".

Control Point #1 was reached on course 1½ minutes early in Wing formation. Division assembly line was flown on course and at proper altitude.

The Group swung nine miles south of Control Point #2 in order to gain proper interval in Division Column. Preceding Groups were doing the same. Remainder of the route to the I.P., after coming back on course, was flown approximately as briefed.

Bombing was done visually with squadrons in trail. The lead and high squadron Bombardiers identified the MPI about 2/3rds of the way down the run. Haze, smoke and fire caused interference in identification of the target. The high squadron Bombardier experienced difficulty when the bombsight clutch arm pin fell out as he prepared to "clutch in". The low squadron Bombardier bombed on the smoke markers of the lead squadron because of inability to pinpoint the MPI, which was obscured by smoke and fire. C-1 functioned normally for all squadrons, and the mixed load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 12h2 from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be very good.

Rally was accomplished without difficulty. Return route was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #216

RECKLINGHAUSEN

23 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 8,000 feet. The Group left the Bunker five minutes early and went left of course, in order to assemble in Wing formation behind "Woodcraft Able" leader.

Course over England was flown as briefed until reaching Gravesend where the 94th "A" Group swung right of course. The 457th Group followed in trail.

Control Point #1 was reached ten minutes late as a result of the turn off course at Gravesend and a wind change, but on course. Division Assembly Line was flown slightly right of course and in Division column.

Route to the I.P. was flown as briefed, except for a difference of twelve minutes between briefed and actual time. Majority of the time was initially lost during route over England.

The I.P. was crossed on course. Cloud coverage at the target was nil. Bombing was done visually in squadron formation. The lead and high squadrons were able to identify the MFI about 15 miles from the target. The low squadron bombed by triangulation. A slight ground haze and smoke caused some interference in sighting. AAGF was moderate, accurate, and tracking. AFCE functioned normally for all squadrons; the 500 lb GP's being dropped at 1340 from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results as shown by strike photos were excellent.

Return was accomplished by the Group without difficulty. The return route was flown on course and at proper altitude. A normal let-down was made and the formation landed at base without further incident.

Mission #217

HOPSTEN

24 March 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 6,000 feet. The Group was late in assembling because of a late take-off by some aircraft.

Point "C" was cut off in order to gain time. The Group assembled in Wing formation just before Point "D". Remainder of the route to Control Point #1 was flown on course.

Control Point #1 was reached on time, on course, and in Wing formation. Deviations to the left of course along the Division Assembly Line were necessary in order to remain in Division column.

The Group was left of course, in Division formation, from Control Point "2" to 5236N-0800E where the formation came back on course and flew the remainder of the route to the I.P. as briefed.

Bombing was visual, with squadrons in trail. About half-way down the bomb run, the Group lead aircraft was hit by AAGF, which knocked out the

[REDACTED]

electrical system and rendered the bombsight inoperative. Lead was turned over to the deputy aircraft, but after a short interval, it was also hit by AAIF, which knocked out the VHF and wounded the Radio Operator. Bombardier was not able to sight on the #1 target, so formation proceeded to Plantlume, #2 target. Pattern was largely scattered, because of confusion caused by AAIF. The low squadron lead aircraft was hit by AAIF and had to leave the formation; performed visual sighting on Wiedenbruck Marshalling Yards. The lead was taken over by the deputy who, with the remainder of the squadron, bombed the #1 target - Hopsten Airfield. C-1 functioned normally for the low squadron. The high and lead squadrons had to make a manual run. The high squadron leader's bombsight became inoperative and the leader attempted to turn lead over to the deputy, but VHF was cut and the deputy did not get the signal in time and consequently released bombs approximately 15 seconds late. The bomb load of 100 lb GP's were released from 101L to 101T at 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be fair to good.

After bombing, rally was not accomplished as briefed because the lead squadron had bombed a different target than the other two. Rally was finally made at 1021 hours, north of course. After reassembling, the Group turned left in order to come back on the briefed route. The Wing formation was not sighted. Over the North Sea, the Group deviated about ten miles left of course and entered England below Cromer, because H2X equipment was cut and winds had blown them south over the North Sea. A normal let-down was made and the Group landed without difficulty.

Mission #218

TWENTE/ENSCHEDE

24 March 1945

Assembled in Group formation as low squadron (Polebrook, lead). For details of route to the bomb run, reference is invited to 351st's mission folder.

Bombing was visual, with squadrons in trail. Lead squadron was too far left and did not drop, making it necessary to execute a 360 degree turn for a second run. The low squadron released its bombs on the first run. There were no clouds but there was a slight haze and smoke. MPI was sighted briefly two minutes before bombs away, but then Bombardier made slight correction by triangulation. C-1 functioned normally, and the 500 lb GP's of the low squadron were dropped at 1740 from 21,400 feet.

Bomb results of the low squadron were fair as shown by strike photos.

Low and high squadrons did not wait for lead to make a 360 for second run but returned to base as advised by Air Commander. Route was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and squadron landed without incident.

Mission #219

PLAUM

26 March 1945

The Group took off without difficulty and flew to the assembly area over

A-59. The Group assembled over A-59 at briefed altitude, plus 1000 feet (7,000 feet) in order to get above clouds in the assembly area.

The Group assembled behind Polebrook, in Wing formation. Route was flown considerably south of course in trail of the Wing Leader. The Group was right of course at Control Point #1 and slightly left at Control Point #2. The formation had to climb to altitudes ranging from one to ten thousand feet above briefed altitude in order to avoid high clouds along the route.

Control Point #1 was reached twenty miles south of course and about 11 minutes early. The Group was in proper position behind Polebrook and followed them throughout.

The formation came back on course about twenty minutes before the last turn before the I.P. After making the last turn before the briefed I.P., the formation swung off to the right of course, following preceding groups. Word was then received that the No. 1 target was covered by clouds and that it would be necessary to attack the No. 2 target. The Group then executed a 270 degree turn in order to get squadrons in trail behind the 351st Group formation.

As a result of receiving late information that the No. 1 target was covered, an I.P. different from briefed for the No. 2 target had to be selected. Bombing was done by squadrons in trail. The ground on the bomb run was obscured by clouds from 6/10ths to 8/10ths, making it necessary for a combination PFF/Visual assist to be performed by all squadrons. The bomb run was made all the more difficult because Bombardiers had no briefed checkpoints to go by when openings in the clouds permitted. Weather and clouds made it necessary for squadrons to let down to about 1500 feet below briefed altitude. The MPI was identified about eight miles from the target. Some difficulty was encountered in identification because smoke and clouds partially obscured the target. The lead and low made a manual run; C-1 pilot on the high functioned normally. The bomb load of 500 lb GP's were dropped at 1111 from 23,500 feet.

Strike photos indicate that bomb results of all squadrons were poor.

After bombing, the Group proceeded to the rally point, where the formation reassembled and began the route home. Course was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the majority of the aircraft landed at base without difficulty. Seven aircraft landed on the continent for refueling purposes. Two aircraft landed away in England.

Mission #220

BERLIN

28 March 1945

The group took off and flew to the assembly area over C-16. Assembly conditions were poor. The Bunker was not received well, and haze and heavy contrails made it necessary to raise assembly altitude to briefed plus 4,500 feet. Polebrook and Deenethorpe crossed our assembly area during assembly.

The Group assembled in Wing formation behind Deenethorpe instead of Polebrook as briefed. Polebrook apparently was unable to locate the Wing formation at this point because of heavy contrails and clouds, but later joined the Division Bomber Stream.

Control Point #1 was reached on course and one minute early. The Group was not in proper position but was 9th "A" Group instead of "C" because of reasons mentioned above. After leaving Control Point #1, the formation deviated to the right of course, following Wing Leader.

Route to the target was uneventful and was flown on course. Between Control Point #1 and #2, it was necessary to climb to altitudes ranging from 1,000 to 5,000 feet above briefed in order to avoid contrails and clouds.

Cloud coverage at the target was 9/10ths to 10/10ths and it was necessary to bomb the PFF secondary in Group formation by means of H2X equipment. Poor visibility caused constant interference. G-1 functioned normally and no other difficulties were encountered. The mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1053½ hours from 26,500 feet.

Bomb results were unobserved due to cloud coverage.

After bombing, the Group proceeded to fly the briefed course out. At approximately 1122 hours, word was received to abandon the briefed withdrawal route and proceed home via the penetration course. The Group was separated from the Combat Wing because of contrails and clouds. Shortly after crossing friendly lines, the Group began to let down to an altitude of from 4,000 to 2,000 feet. The formation was dispersed during the process and individual aircraft proceeded to base.

Mission #221

BERMEN

30 March 1945

Assembled about 25 miles southeast of the Clatton Bunker because of clouds. The formation was at briefed altitude but late assembling because of the difficult weather conditions.

The Group never assembled in Wing formation but proceeded directly to Control Point #1 in order to gain time. About five minutes prior to Control Point #1, the Group came upon a thick layer of clouds and haze. The Group was unable to get above or around the cloud layer, and Air Commander had no choice but to fly through it in an attempt to assemble with the Division at Control Point #1.

Control Point #1 was reached on time and on course, but the Group was still in the cloud layer and it was decided rather than turn right at Control Point #1 to continue on the same heading until the aircraft broke out in the clear and were able to reassemble. Consequently, Division Assembly Line was not flown as briefed as the Group did not break out of the clouds and reassemble until they were approximately 40 miles left of course. After reassembling, the Group turned right and assembled in Division formation at the tail end of the Division column at the Dutch coast.

Route from the Dutch coast to the I.P. was flown on course. The formation was last because of reasons mentioned above.

Bombing was done in Group formation, by means of a combination PFF/Visual assist. Cloud coverage was 5/10ths to 7/10ths. C-1 Pilot functioned normally, and the 500 lb RDX bombs were dropped at 1413 from 24,500 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be very good, with several direct hits.

Return route was flown approximately as briefed. Over the Zuider Zee, weather conditions were bad, and the Group let down below briefed altitude, in order to get below the clouds. The English coast was crossed at Cromer and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #222

HALLE

31 March 1945

The Group took off and flew to the assembly area over C-16. Assembly conditions were poor. The Bunker was not received well, and haze and heavy contrails made it necessary to raise assembly altitude to briefed plus 4,500 feet. Polebrook and Deenethorpe crossed over assembly area during assembly.

The Group assembled in Wing formation behind Deenethorpe instead of Polebrook as briefed. Polebrook apparently was unable to locate the Wing formation at this point because of heavy contrails and clouds, but later joined the Division Bomber Stream.

Control Point #1 was reached on course and one minute early. The Group was not in proper position but was 9th "B" Group instead of "C" because of reasons mentioned above. After leaving Control Point #1, the formation deviated to the right of course, following Wing Leader.

Route to the target was uneventful and was flown on course. Between Control Point #1 and #2, it was necessary to climb to altitudes ranging from 1,000 to 5,000 feet above briefed in order to avoid contrails and clouds.

Cloud coverage at the target was 9/10ths to 10/10ths and it was necessary to bomb the PFF secondary in Group formation by means of H2X equipment. Poor visibility caused constant interference. C-1 functioned normally and no other difficulties were encountered. The 1,000 lb GP's were dropped at 0915 from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were unobserved due to 10/10ths cloud coverage.

After bombing, the Group proceeded to fly the briefed course out. At approximately 1122 hours, word was received to abandon the briefed withdrawal route and proceed home via the penetration course. The Group was separated from the Combat Wing because of contrails and clouds. Shortly after crossing friendly lines, the Group began to let down to an altitude of from 4,000 to 2,000 feet. The formation was dispersed during the process and individual aircraft proceeded to base.

Mission #223

ROTBURG

4 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at briefed altitude plus 1,000 feet, upon recommendation of the Weather Aircraft.

The Group assembled in Wing formation without incident and followed in Wing formation to Control Point #1. The last point before Cromer was cut off, in order to gain time.

Control Point #1 was reached about five miles north of course, in trail of the Wing formation. Division Assembly Line was flown approximately as briefed.

Course to the I.P. was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. Scouting Force recommended that a run be attempted on Fassburg at 15,000 feet instead of 12,000 feet, because the #1 target was covered by 10/10ths clouds.

Woodcraft Able Leader recommended that the Group go halfway down the bomb run toward the #1 target and then turn to Fassburg. Shortly after this, Woodcraft Baker turned left and the 457th Group turned right and made a 360 degree turn, intending to use Ulzen as an I.P. The formation passed south of Ulzen and made a run on Fassburg but could not pick up the target visually. A 360 degree turn was then made to the left, in order to make a second run. The target was seen for a short interval but was covered over before a sighting could be made. No bombs were dropped.

Almost an hour's time was lost because of the delay in the target area. Except for difference in time, return route was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group landed without difficulty.

Mission #224

INGOLSTADT

5 April 1945

The lead A/C of the lead squadron crashed and exploded in the process of becoming airborne. The scheduled low A/C lead took over the Group lead position. Because of this, take off by the other A/C was delayed from twenty minutes to a half hour.

As a result of the delay the Group was three minutes late assembling. Assembly altitude was at briefed plus 1,000 feet because of clouds.

From the bunker the formation proceeded directly to Point K in order to gain time and assemble in Wing formation. Point K was reached two minutes late and the Group was unable to assemble in Wing formation. Air Commander then decided to go directly to Control Point #2 in order to cut off Division Column and get into formation. Consequently the Division assembly line was not flown as briefed.

Failure of navigational aids and in particular N2X equipment caused the formation to end up about fifteen miles north of Control Point #2. The bomber stream was sighted off the right at this point and the Group turned right toward the briefed course in order to intercept the Division Formation. At about 1020 hours at 0830 East the Group assembled in Division Formation behind Foxhole Charlie. Course to the second to last turn before the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed. At this turn, the Group turned out of bomber stream to the right in order to go to the briefed primary.

Bombing was done by squadrons in trail and a visual sighting was performed. The lead and low squadrons had to let down to about 7,000 feet below briefed altitude in order to avoid clouds. The low squadron C-1 pilot was inoperative and it was necessary for them to make a manual run. C-1 pilot of the lead squadron functioned normally. Some interference in identification was caused by smoke, making it necessary for the low squadron to bomb by triangulation. The lead squadron identified the target at I.P. The high squadron was unable to release its bombs on the first run for fear of dropping on the low squadron. A 360 degree turn was executed and visual sighting performed. C-1 pilot functioned normally. Bombardier released bombs by triangulation. The mixed load of GP's and IB's were released from 1149 to 1209 hours from 14,300 feet.

Bomb results were partially obscured by clouds and smoke.

After bombing the lead and low squadrons executed a 360 degree turn in order to wait for the high squadron. Shortly after the high squadron bombed, Group rally was accomplished without difficulty. The formation then attempted to find the Division Column, but was unsuccessful. The Group then proceeded on the return route. Difficult weather conditions, combined with the failure of navigational aids, caused the Group to deviate considerably north of course. Division advised the Air Commander to prepare for frontal penetration. Group first attempted to go around it by deviating even more north of course. Air Commander then decided to go through the front by squadrons. Squadrons were well separated by both interval and altitude. A/C broke into the clear over the Continent, but they were widely scattered and proceeded to base individually.

Mission #225

LUXEMBURG-UNIZEN

7 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 15,000 feet as briefed; no difficulties were encountered.

Combat Wing assembled without incident. Course over England was flown as briefed, except that Point "D" was cut off in order to arrive at Control Point #1 on time.

~~SECRET~~
Control Point #1 was reached on time and on course. Division Assembly Line was flown slightly left of course because of a wind change, but the Group was in proper position in Division Formation.

Route over the Continent was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed, except for the difference between briefed and actual time. The formation was about fifteen minutes late because winds were other than briefed. Weather Scouting Force informed the Air Commander of clouds over the No. 1 target but that there was a possible chance of performing a visual sighting.

The Group made a run on the No. 1 target, with squadrons in trail, but cloud coverage prevented a visual sighting, from being made, and bombs were not released. The Group then turned right and passed over the areas of the Nos. 2 and 3 targets. After having passed over these targets, the Group executed a 180 degree turn and went over the No. 3 target, preparatory to making a run on the No. 2 target. As squadrons passed over the No. 3 target, the low squadron was able to pick up the target and attack it visually. No difficulty was encountered. C-1 pilot functioned normally. The lead and high squadrons continued on to the No. 2 target. Cloud coverage was about 4/10ths and both squadrons were compelled to perform a combination PFF/Visual sighting. Both squadrons bombed by triangulation. C-1 Pilot was inoperative for lead and low squadrons. The 150 lb GP's were dropped at 1533 from 15,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be very good.

After bombing, Group rally was accomplished without incident. The formation then joined the Division column, though not in proper position, because of the delay in the target area. Course from rally point was flown in trail of the Division column. Deviations to the left of course were necessary in order to remain in Division formation. Remainder of the route was uneventful until the Group reached the Glatton Bunker, where it was necessary to make an instrument set-down through the undercast.

Mission #226

HALBERSTADT

8 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 6,000 feet as briefed.

The Group assembled in Wing formation without difficulty. The route from the Glatton Bunker to Control Point #1 was flown as briefed.

Control Point #1 was reached on course and one minute late but in proper position in Division column. Division Assembly Line was flown as briefed.

Over the continent, the course was flown approximately as briefed. However, it was necessary to do a considerable amount of "S'ing" before reaching the Rhine, in order to stay in formation, because Groups ahead were closely bunched. This, combined with a wind change, resulted in a loss of about twenty minutes' time. After crossing the Rhine, the Division formation straightened out and proper interval between groups was again obtained. On the second leg before the briefed I.P., weather scouting force reported instrument conditions at both Nos. 1 and 2 targets. Shortly thereafter, scouting force stated it

could not contact "Woodcraft Able" to report conditions at No. 1 target as "combination fair" and at No. 2 target as "instrument." The Group Leader contacted the 94th "A" and "B" Groups and informed them of statements of scouting force, and it was decided to bomb the No. 2 target.

In order to avoid "prop wash", and I.P. was selected at 5122N and 1052E, and the Group started a PFF run on the No. 2 target (Halberstadt). Cloud coverage was about 2/10ths and the target area opened up sufficiently to allow a visual sighting to be performed. However, there was not sufficient time to split the Group into squadrons and consequently bombing was done in Group formation, with the lead A/C performing the sighting. The MPI was picked out by triangulation. Some difficulty was experienced in identifying the target because of a dense layer of smoke caused by bombing of the preceding groups. C-1 Pilot functioned normally and no other difficulties were encountered. The 150 lb GP's were dropped at 11148 from 20,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be good, pattern being centered in the target area.

After bombing, the Group turned off the target to the left, rejoined the Wing, and followed them in trail. Route was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further incident.

Mission #227

FURSTENFELDBRUCK

9 April 1945

The Group assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 5,000 feet as briefed; no difficulty was encountered.

The Group assembled in Wing formation without incident. Route over England was flown in trail of the Wing Leader. The formation was about one minute early during the course over England.

Control Point #1 was reached on course, in proper position in Wing formation, and two minutes early. The Group deviated to the left of course along the Division Assembly, following the preceding groups.

Over the continent, the Group came back on course, following the Division Leader, and flew the remainder of the course to the I.P. approximately as briefed, except that in the vicinity of Lake Constance, the Division Bomber Stream executed a double-drift to the left. Scouting Force reported visual conditions at No. 1 target, and the Group was split into squadrons in order to attack this target (Furstenfeldbruck) visually.

Cloud coverage at the target was nil and visibility was excellent. The I.P. was crossed on course by all squadrons. The MPI was identified at the I.P. C-1 Pilot functioned normally for all three squadrons, and the mixed bomb load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1708 from 23,900 feet.

Bomb results were good with several direct hits being scored on the target.

~~SECRET~~

Both Group and Wing rally were accomplished without difficulty. Return route was uneventful and was flown approximately on course, in trail of the Wing Leader. About thirty minutes from the continental coast, the Group deviated to the left of course, in order to avoid "prop wash" from the groups ahead. The English coast was crossed at Dungeness. A normal let-down was made, and the Group landed without further incident.

Mission #225

GRANIERBURG

10 April 1945

Assembled on the Clatton Bunker at 8,000 feet as briefed.

Course over England was flown approximately as briefed, except that the formation cut off Southwold in order to gain time.

Control Point #1 was reached one minute early, about five miles left of course. The Group joined in Division formation without incident and flew the Assembly Line in trail of the Division column.

Course to the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed. Slight deviations to the left and right of course were necessary in order to remain in the Division Bomber Stream. In the vicinity of the I.P., information was received that the No. 1 target was open and that visual bombing was possible.

The Group swung about five miles north of the briefed I.P. in order to permit squadrons to get interval for visual run. Bombing was done by squadrons in trail on the No. 1 target of Oranienburg. Cloud coverage at the target was nil. The general target area was located by check points, and Bombardiers were able to identify the MPI about three minutes before bombs away. Some interference was caused by "prop wash" from preceding squadrons. C-I Pilot functioned normally for all squadrons, the mixed load of GP's and IB's were dropped at 1453 from 25,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be generally good for all squadrons.

Just after bombs away, the Group was attacked by 3 to 4 Me-262's, and one A/C was lost. The lead A/C was forced to leave the formation and turn the lead over to the high squadron leader. Slight confusion resulted, forcing the formation to deviate a little right of course just after bombs away. Squadrons rallied shortly thereafter and rejoined the Wing formation. Return route was flown approximately as briefed, in trail of the Division Bomber Stream. A normal let-down was made and the Group returned to base without further difficulty.

Mission #229

FRETHAM

12 April 1945

The A/C took off and flew to the assembly area over Y-35 without difficulty. The Group assembled on Y-35 at 21,000 feet as briefed.

The Group was assembled at 1040 hours and assembled in Wing Formation at Y-35 at 1047 hours. The Group did not let down to 19,500 feet as briefed, but remained at assembly altitude in order to form behind 94th "A" Group. Except

[REDACTED]

for difference in actual and briefed altitude, the course was flown approximately as briefed.

The Group was assembled behind Polebrook and followed them along the Division Assembly Line. No difficulties were encountered.

Course to the vicinity of the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed. The last turn before the I.P. was cut off, following the Wing Leader. Group Leader had obtained Scouting Force information through the 94th "C" Group that #1 target was clear. Squadrons took interval without difficulty and prepared for a visual run. Polebrook swung south of the I.P. and the Group started to follow them, but decided to turn to left toward the briefed run.

As a result of this, squadrons crossed the I.P. about three miles south of course. The Group attacked the #1 target, Freiham, visually. The MPI was obscured by smoke and was not identified by squadrons until about 30 or 40 seconds before bombs away. A little difficulty was caused by Polebrook when they came in to the #1 target at the same altitude from the right. Our lead squadron bombed immediately behind their high squadron, with good results. The bomb load of 500 lb RDX were dropped at 135 $\frac{1}{2}$ from 26,500 feet.

Group and Wing rally was accomplished without difficulty immediately after the turn off the target. Return route was flown approximately as briefed in trail of Wing leader, except in the vicinity of the Belgian Coast, where the Group deviated to the north of course to avoid weather. Remainder of the route was flown as briefed. The Group entered England at Dungeness and returned to base without further difficulty.

Mission #230

ROYAN

14 April 1945

Assembled on the Clatton Bunker at 6,000 feet as briefed.

The Group left the Bunker at 123 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours at briefed altitude and assembled in Wing formation at March. Remainder of the course was flown as briefed, in trail of the Wing Leader. The English coast was crossed 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes early, at briefed altitude.

The Wing joined the Division formation at Beachy Head, and the Group was in proper position. Division Assembly Line was flown approximately as briefed. The continental coast was crossed on course, at proper altitude, but 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes early because of a tail wind.

Course to the target was flown as briefed, except for slight deviations in order to remain in Division column. Briefed altitude was maintained until shortly after crossing Control Point #3, where it was necessary to climb 2,500 feet above briefed altitude in order to avoid low status clouds. The Group was running about 10 to 15 minutes early because winds were not as briefed. At point before the I.P., the Scouting Force stated that the target was open for visual bombing. The squadrons took interval without difficulty and prepared for a visual run. The I.P. was crossed slightly right of course, following Division Leader.

The Group attacked the No. 1 target (Boyan) visually, with each squadron performing its own sighting. The 500 lb RDX bombs were dropped at 1106½ from 18,000 feet.

Bomb results were poor for the lead squadron; poor for the low, and fair for the high squadron.

Group and Wing rally was accomplished without difficulty. In between the target and Control Point #2, the Group deviated about 15 miles right of course, following the Division column. Let-down was begun at 1557N and 0047W and no difficulties were encountered. The Group was ahead of schedule because of difference between briefed and actual winds. The Group entered England at Selsey Bill and proceeded to base without further difficulty.

Mission #231

POINTE DE GRAVE

15 April 1945

Aircraft took off and flew to the Assembly Area over A-58 without difficulty. The Group assembled on A-58 at 6,000 feet as briefed.

The Group left the Assembly Area on time, on course, and assembled in Wing formation in between Paris and Control Point #1. Control Point #1 was reached on time, on course. The Group was in proper position in the "U" Force formation behind "Woodcraft Able" leader.

Course to the orbiting point was flown as briefed. Arriving at the orbiting point, the Group executed nine 360 degree turns for one hour and eight minutes until "Woodcraft Able" leader directed that all sections attack Target No. 17 visually. The Group then divided into sections; sections took interval and came across the I.P. on course.

Bombing was done by 6-ship sections on Target No. 17, visually. The only difficulty encountered was from "prop wash" caused by Polebrook's high squadron. All the sections except Section 6 dropped their bombs on the first run. The #6 Section was unable to drop their bombs on the first run because of interference caused by "prop wash", executed a 360 degree turn in order to make a second run, and released their bombs successfully. Observed results for all sections were excellent.

After bombing, no rally was accomplished, as sections elected to return to base individually as permitted by instructions contained in field order. All sections were behind schedule because of the time initially lost at the orbiting point. Return route was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. No difficulties were encountered in let-down. The continental coast was crossed at Cherbourg; entered England at Anvil Point and landed at base without difficulty.

Mission #232

REGENSBURG

16 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at briefed altitude, plus 1,000 feet, because of prevailing weather conditions at briefed assembly altitude.

The Group left the Bunker on course, one minute early, and continued to remain at 9,000 feet instead of descending. During the route over England, the Group was forced off to the right of course by the 40th CSW, which was flying a parallel course off to our left. Because of a navigational error in estimating the time of arrival at Control Point #1, the Group executed a 360 degree turn in order to lose time. As a result, the Group arrived at Control Point #1 three minutes late. Combat Wing Assembly was not accomplished over England because Polebrook and Deemethorpe were ahead of our Group.

Division Assembly Line was flown on course and 4,000 feet above briefed altitude (9,000 feet). The Group was not in proper position because of the time lost in error over England. The Group succeeded in gaining time along the line because winds were not as briefed, and arrived at the continental coast at 1343 hours, three minutes early.

Over the continent, the Group caught up with the Wing formation at 1411 hours at 50h2N and 04h2E and assumed its proper position in formation. Remainder of the course to the I.P. was flown approximately as briefed except for slight deviations in course in order to remain in Division column. Upon receiving information from Scouting Force that the No. 1 target was open, the Group Leader decided to attack it. Some difficulty was encountered with the lead PFF aircraft equipment about 25 miles before the I.P.

Bombing was done visually, in squadron formation. MPI was identified without difficulty, and the 1000 lb bombs were dropped at 1555 from 24,000 feet. Observed results were all excellent.

Group rally was accomplished at 4845N and 1151E without difficulty. Shortly after, the Wing reassembled and joined the Division column. Return route was flown in Division formation. Deviations to the left of course were necessary in order to remain in Division formation. Let-down was accomplished as briefed. The Group reached the continental coast at 1640 hours, entered England a little right of Dungeness and flew directly to base, because aircraft were low on fuel.

Mission #233

DRESDEN

17 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 5,000 feet as briefed; no difficulties were encountered.

* The Group left the Bunker one minute early, crossed March on course and then deviated to the left of course in an attempt to assemble in Wing formation. The Group assembled in Wing formation after crossing Point "D". The Group arrived at Clacton four minutes early in Wing formation.

The Group was assembled in proper position behind the 94th "B" Group. Division Assembly Line was flown approximately on course except for slight deviations, following the Division column. The formation arrived at the continental coast about eight minutes early because of winds.

Course to the vicinity of the I.P. was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed except that they were below briefed altitude at Control

Point #3 and from there to the I.P., in order to remain in formation. Before reaching the I.P., Scouting Force had recommended bombing to be done at base reference altitude plus one, and adjustments were made accordingly. Scouting Force also stated that weather was good at that altitude but that air-to-ground visibility was poor. Squadrons took interval without difficulty and prepared for a visual run on the No. 1 target.

The I.P. was not crossed on course because of interference from dense, persistent contrails and thick ground haze. The run started out as a PFF run but about two minutes before the BRL, the lead Bombardier succeeded in picking up the MPI at intervals about two minutes before the BRL. Bombing of the lead squadron was a combination PFF/Visual assist and triangulation. The low squadron made three runs on the target; was unable to triangulate in time on the first run and not able to triangulate at all on the second run. The low squadron began a third run, but the PFF equipment became inoperative and no sighting of any kind could be performed, so they returned to base with their bombs. The high squadron made three runs. Haze, smoke and contrails interfered on the first and second runs. On the third run, the squadron made a PFF/visual assist run and released bombs successfully. The weather at the target became increasingly difficult. Cloud coverage had increased from nil on the first run to 3/10ths-4/10ths.

No Group rally was accomplished because of the delay in the target area. Squadrons proceeded home individually, following the briefed route. The lead squadron had rejoined the Division column and followed in trail. The low and high squadrons flew the withdrawal route individually and uneventfully. No difficulties were encountered. The continental coast was crossed at the briefed point. Let-down was accomplished by all squadrons as weather permitted. Squadrons entered England at Dungeness and proceeded directly to base.

Mission #234

FREISING

18 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 5,000 feet as briefed.

The Group left the Glatton Bunker two minutes early and succeeded in assembling in Wing formation at Point "D" and followed "Woodcraft Aole" leader on course to Control Point #1. The interval between the 94th "C" and "E" groups was only one minute because our Group was one-half minute late and the 94th "C" group was one-half minute early.

Division Assembly Line was flown on course and in proper position behind the 94th "A" group. No difficulty was encountered.

Route over the continent was flown approximately as briefed. The Group was about five miles left of course most of the route, in order to remain in Division column. Information from Scouting Force was received just before the I.P., stating that cloud coverage was 5/10ths to 6/10ths but clouds were moving and there was a good chance for visual bombing. Squadrons took interval without difficulty, swung slightly right of the I.P., because of AAGP, and prepared for a visual run.

A run was made on Traunstein, the No. 1 target, but it was obscured by clouds, and no one released their bombs. Group Leader then ordered squadrons to make a PFF run on the No. 2 target, Freising, with the low squadron leading, since the PFF equipment of the lead squadron was not operating normally. About a third of the way down the run, the clouds broke sufficiently to permit a visual run. Low squadron bombed just ahead of the lead squadron. However, it was necessary for the high squadron to execute a 360 degree turn and make a second run on the target because they were unable to identify the MPI on the first run. No other difficulties were encountered. The 250 lb G's were dropped at 14:57 from 18,000 feet.

Bomb results were excellent.

After bombing, the lead and low squadrons rallied but did not wait for the high squadron which was in the process of the second run. The Group did not rejoin the Wing formation but succeeded in getting in Division column two or three groups behind its briefed position. The high squadron also tacked on to the Division column slightly farther back. Squadrons followed the course approximately as briefed. Over Belgium, the Division column was considerable spread out and staggered somewhat to the right of course. The lead and low squadrons slightly more to the right, about fifteen miles off course, in order to avoid "prop wash" and haze. The high squadron followed the bomber stream. Route from the continental coast was uneventful and was flown approximately as briefed. A normal let-down was made by all squadrons.

Mission #235

FALKENBERG

19 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 3,000 feet as briefed.

The Group left the bunker on time and on course. Route over England was flown approximately as briefed. The Group assembled in Wing Formation shortly after leaving March and followed in trail of the Woodcraft Able leader to Control Point #1.

The Group was in proper position in formation and was on time, but flew the first part of the Division Assembly line slightly left of course following the Division Column. Continental Coast was reached at 06:49 hours, two minutes late in Division Formation.

Course to the I.P. was flown as briefed except that on the leg before the I.P. the Group deviated to the left of course about five miles to keep from over-running Deenethorpe, which was about 3,000 feet below our formation. The Group then cut the last turn before the I.P. short in order to gain time and come over the I.P. on course. Scouting Force reported that the target was open and squadrons took interval for a visual run on the #1 target.

All squadrons bombed the #1 target, Falkenberg, visually. The lead squadron's run was entirely visual. The low and high squadrons began a combination visual-Gee-H run, but the bombardiers' took over about six minutes before the BRL and performed visual sightings. The MPI was identified about six minutes before the BRL by all squadrons. No difficulties were encountered.

The mixed load of G's and IB's were dropped at 1102 from 25,100 feet.

Bomb results of all squadrons were excellent.

Group rally was accomplished within about five minutes after the turn off the target. Wing rally was never accomplished because the Groups were greatly scattered after bombing. Our Group reassembled with the Division Column but not in proper position. Return route was flown on course except for a deviation twelve miles north of course prior to reaching Control Point #4, in order to lose time and to gain more interval between Groups, who at this time, seemed to be "bunching". The Group recrossed the Continental Coast as briefed, entered England at Clacton and proceeded directly to base. Let-down was accomplished approximately as briefed.

Mission #236

SEDDIN

20 April 1945

Assembled on the Glatton Bunker at 5,000 feet as briefed.

On the last turn around the Bunker, the 11st Combat Wing flew through our assembly area, making it necessary for the Group to deviate to the left of course in order to avoid a collision. Consequently, the route over England was flown north of course until a point about ten miles northeast of March when the Group turned toward the briefed route in order to intercept the Wing on the last leg before Control Point #1. The Group assembled in Wing formation on the last leg before Control Point #1 and flew the remainder of the route over England in Wing formation.

Control Point #1 was reached one minute late but in proper position in Wing and Division formation. Division Assembly Line was flown as briefed, except that the formation was losing time because winds were not as briefed. The continental coast was reached at 0905 hours, four minutes late.

Course from the Continental coast until the point of turn off of the 9th "A" and "B" groups was flown in Division formation and on course. As the groups ahead turned off for other targets, our Group assumed the lead of our task force and continued on to the vicinity of the I.P. as briefed. Scouting Force reported that our target was open and visual bombing was possible. The formation swung slightly right of course just prior to the I.P., in order to gain proper interval between squadrons.

A run was made on the No. 1 target (Seddin) in squadron formation. The lead and high squadrons made a complete visual run but the low squadron began a GI run which became visual after they had proceeded about one-quarter of the way down the run. The MPI was identified by all squadrons at least six minutes before the B.R.L. No difficulties were encountered, and the 250 lb GP's were dropped at 1123 from 20,000 feet.

Bomb results were observed to be excellent by all squadrons.

After bombing, the Group rallied without difficulty and proceeded on the return route. Course was flown as briefed and was uneventful. A normal let-down

was made without difficulty. The Group entered England at Clacton and returned to base without incident.

EVENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

British double summer time became effective on Monday, 2 April 1945. At 0200 hours on 2 April all timepieces were changed to read 0300 hours. This change became effective in the UK, France, Belgium and the Netherlands.

The USO Show, "Miff Ferrie," was presented at the Aero Club on 1 April.

'TO EVERY MEMBER OF THE AEF: THE BATTLE OF THE RUHR HAS ENDED WITH COMPLETE SUCCESS. FOLLOWING HARD UPON THE FINAL DESTRUCTION OF THE GERMAN FORCES WEST OF THE RHINE, THE TWENTY FIRST ARMY GROUP THRUST POWERFULLY ACROSS THAT RIVER WITH THE U.S. NINTH ARMY UNDER COMMAND. SIMULTANEOUSLY, RAPID DRIVES ACROSS THE RHINE AND FROM THE REMAGEN BRIDGEHEAD BY TWELFTH AND SIXTH ARMY GROUPS PROVIDED THE SOUTHERN ARM OF A GREAT DOUBLE ENVELOPMENT WHICH COMPLETELY ENCIRCLED THE ENTIRE GERMAN ARMY GROUP "B" AND TWO CORPS OF ARMY GROUP "H", WHOSE MOBILITY WAS RENDERED ALMOST ZERO BY OUR MAGNIFICENT AND TIRELESS AIR FORCES. THEREAFTER, IN THE POCKET THIS CREATED THE TWELFTH ARMY GROUP ELIMINATED TWENTY-ONE ENEMY DIVISIONS, INCLUDING THREE PANZER, ONE PANZER GRENADIER AND THREE PARACHUTE DIVISIONS. Request for railway travel warrants authorized for passes, leaves and furloughs will be submitted to the Quartermaster Office, this station, at least thirty-six (36) hours prior to departure.

The Friday night dances in the Aero-Club were held on the nights of 6, 20, and 27 April. That of 13 April as well as scheduled Officers' Club and NCO club dances were cancelled following news of the death of President Roosevelt.

The baseball team, recently organized, has revealed some exceptional talent, and promises to have a successful season. A softball league has been organized on the base and is already active. This month has also seen the inauguration of an extensive P.T. program embracing the entire ground personnel of the drome. This has received admirable cooperation on the part of the various units and has elicited a surprising amount of enthusiasm on the part of individual men.

Extensive redecoration during the month has given a fresh and rejuvenated aspect to the Aero-Club. This was enjoyed by the Red Cross girls who gathered from all parts of the ETO to attend the convention held at the Club. The number of men using the facilities of the hobby shop has increased to 100 per week. Discussions led by S-2 officers are even more popular than before. The luncheon bar was popular as usual and the library was a haven for those wishing to enjoy a cheerful fire, a book, a quiet game or a peaceful snooze.

2. American Red Cross

This month has consisted mostly of painting and gardening. With the arrival of warm weather the men wanted to stay out-of-doors, so the only solution was to make the grounds attractive. Grass was planted all around the club, but the most effort was put into the back lawn where the men like to sit and drink tea. After many long hours with picks, shovels, rakes and roller it was finally leveled and packed down ready for the grass seed. The pathways through it were edged with rocks and covered with gravel. In the center a large group insignia was made out of rocks and flowers.

The club is quite a gay looking place with all the bright colors that have been splashed around. The snack bar is red, white and blue. The ceiling is cream, the dado, sky blue, and the tables, bright red. There are three parachutes hanging from the ceiling, the center one, white, and the end ones, red. The ping-pong room has a cream ceiling and red dado, the billiard room, cream ceiling and green dado. One office is maroon and pale blue, and the other, pink and blue.

The ping-pong tournament brought forth quite a bit of talent. It was planned to run everything off except the finals the first night and have the finals on the second night, but the competition grew so keen that the boys couldn't wait another night. Not having planned to award the cup that night, we didn't have it shined up, so all during the finals the cup was being frantically polished. It was given its last buff just in time to be awarded to its owner.

EDUCATION-TRAINING PROGRAM

With the European war turning so favorably toward an early victory, and as combat missions came to a virtual standstill for this Group, all of the plans of the Information-Education Program began to shape into reality. As expected, the library of education books only opened its doors on 1 April. Although relatively small, the selection of subjects was sufficiently varied to satisfy the educational tastes of the readers. In order to enable the library to serve as many personnel as possible it was decided to allow an individual to draw only one book at a time for a period of one week, with an option of a renewal for one week if desired. S/Sgt. Sam S. Cavett assumed complete charge of the library.

The Educational Advisory Council now consists of Lt. Col. Arnold E. Walters as representative of the Commanding Officer; 1st Lt. John G. Boehm, Station Information-Education Officer; Capt. Edward R. Deery, Instruction Officer; 1st Lt. Joseph A. McCusker, Educational Advisement Officer; 1st Lt. James T. Hannon, On-The-Job-Training Officer. Cpl. Price J. Hall is to continue as NCO in charge of all orientation. Pfc. Benjamin Pomerantz also joined the I & E Department in the capacity of Bookkeeping and Accounting Instructor and Records Clerk.

At a meeting of the Educational Advisory Council, held on 22 April 1945, it was decided to initiate, on a reduced scale, an educational program for all ground personnel. This program was to be conducted on duty time, but until V-E Day was actually to have been proclaimed, each man would be limited to but one subject. Of the 35 subjects listed in the Educational Questionnaire which was distributed earlier in the month, 21 were selected to be taught. These were: English Grammar Review, Welding, Spanish, Livestock Production, Elementary Algebra, Bookkeeping & Accounting, Business Law, Business Principles & Management, French, Blue Print Reading, Navigation & Meteorology, Photography, Beginning Radio, Auto Mechanics, Public Speaking, Farm Management, Salesmanship, Psychology. At least 2 and frequently 3 and 4 instructors were selected for each subject.

It was likewise determined by the Council that registration for classes would commence on 30 April and continue for three days. Classes were scheduled to begin one week later and were to be held on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday for one hour each day. It was anticipated, however, that it would be necessary to run two sections of practically every class, one in the morning and one in the afternoon so that all personnel could take advantage of the educational opportunities regardless of working hours.

The former headquarters of the 428th Service Group was secured as an instruction building. It was affectionately called "Conington College." Additional facilities for academic instruction were the library, lounge and gymnasium of the Aero Club. On-the-Job classes were to be conducted in the auto repair shop, photo lab, welding shop and radio school.





SIMULTANEOUSLY, RAPID DRIVES ACROSS THE RHINE AND FROM THE REMAGEN BRIDGEHEAD BY TWELFTH AND SIXTH ARMY GROUPS PROVIDED THE SOUTHERN ARM OF A GREAT DOUBLE ENVELOPEMENT WHICH COMPLETELY ENCIRCLED THE ENTIRE GERMAN ARMY GROUP "B" AND TWO CORPS OF ARMY GROUP "H", WHOSE MOBILITY WAS RENDERED ALMOST ZERO BY OUR MAGNIFICENT AND TIRELESS AIR FORCES. These domestic money orders are designed for use only in the United States post offices and their branches and stations, and in the conduct of money order business with certain American countries with which money order service is operated on a semi-domestic basis.

"4. They are not intended for use as negotiable instruments in dealings with the personnel of liberated areas. US domestic postal money orders drawn in favor of military personnel or issued at APO's and subsequently coming into the possession of French civilians cannot be redeemed without protracted negotiations between the individual and the US Government."

Control of AAF Watches

1. The following policies are set forth within this command to establish control of Army Air Force watches in accordance with 1st Air Division Instruction 65-6, dd 7 Apr 45, and 65-14, dd 28 Mar 45 and Secret Letter, HQ US Strategic AF in Europe, subject: "Navigation Watches and Sextants", 413.6, dd 4 Apr 45, 1st Ind., HQ Eighth AF, dd 24 Apr 45, and 2d Ind., HQ 1st Air Division, dd 26 Apr 45.

2. All AAF watches, regardless to whom they are issued are to be controlled by the Group Navigator and are the responsibility (as property) of the Squadron Supply Officer. Appropriate supply officers will issue watches on authority of controlling officer. The controlling officer (Group Navigator) will be kept informed at all times regarding the status of watches.

3. Watches will be retained by Station on transfer to non-flying status or return to Zone of Interior of holding personnel. Watches are authorized the following personnel:

- a. Pilots, Co-Pilots and Flight Surgeons - one (1) hack watch per individual.
- b. Navigators, Radar Navigators, Bombardiers and Gee H Operators - one (1) hack watch and/or one (1) each any other type watch authorized by Group Navigator.
- c. Group Communications Officer - one (1) hack watch per Radio Operator on station, plus six (6) hack watches to be held in pool for R/T Intercept Operators and Radio Operators. This pool includes watches held by Radio Operators.
- d. Radio Operators - one (1) hack watch per individual included in Group Communication Officer pool.
- e. Group Photo Officer - not over six (6) hack watches to be held in pool for issue on per mission loan for installation in H2X scope cameras.
- f. Squadron Supply Officers will be responsible for checking new crews arriving at this station for possession of AAF watches. All watches will be picked up on squadron property records and reissued to authorized personnel on memorandum receipt in accordance with this directive.
- g. Watches in excess of those authorized by this Memorandum will be turned in to the Station Air Corps Supply. The proper level of supply will be

determined by the controlling officer (Group Navigator). The Squadron Supplies will turn in those watches collected from unauthorized personnel to the controlling officer (Group Navigator), for appropriate disposition.
