DECEMBER, 1943

On the 3rd T/5th Henry W. Stratton, Pvts Joseph Pezzanite, Merrit A. Pierce, and Carl C. Williams were transferred from this unit.

At 1300hrs on the 4th, we boarded the train for Camp Shanks, New York. We arrived there on the 6th at 1500hrs. We immediately underwent our processing for over-seas shipment. While we were at Camp Shanks, Most of the boys had a chance to visit the city of New York. During our stay at Camp Shanks, Pvt Harvey H. Pellack joined the outfit.

We left Camp Shanks on the 11th at 1700hrs. After a trip by rail, we arrived at the ship that was to take us to our destination. We boarded Her at 2130hrs, and took up quarters in one of the lower holds.

On the 19th, after quite a trip across the Atlantic Ocean, We arrived in Scotland. The land looked very good to everyone, especially those of us who were affected by sea sickness.

Our sections started to build their shops. The Automotive Maintenance Section built its garage in the Tech Site, The Supply & Armament Sections also built its shops in the Tech Site. The Ammunition Section began improvements on the Bomb Dump.

JANUARY, 1944

The damp climate was very good for breeding colds. Most of us got a cold, and kept it for quite some time. On the 4th T/5th Harry Polay was admitted to sick quarters with a bad cold. He left the next day for duty, but T/5th Anton C. Johnson and Pfc John L. Thornburgh took his place. On the 6th, Thornburgh left the infirmary for duty, and Johnson re-joined us on the 8th.

On the 9th, 2nd Lt. Veryl D. Sturdevant left for No 1 Bomb Disposal Gp, Royal Engineer Tng Wg. Duke of Yorks Hq. London to study Bomb Reconnaissance.

The morale department is beginning to function again. Our mail is starting to get here from the States.

Lt Sturdevant returned from Bomb Reconnaissance School on the 16th. On the same day, T/4th Palmy S. Matrigrano left for a course of one weeks duration on Browning Vickers Machine Guns, and Pfc John J. Roberts left for a 2 week course on B-17 Armament. The school was #10 School of Technical Training at RAF Station Kirkham.

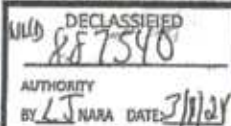
On the 17th Sgt Donald J. Harris left for Bomb Reconnaissance School at AAF Sta Cheddington.

The Automotive Section took in 198 jobs on vehicles on all types for maintenance and repair. One hundred eighty six of these jobs were completed by March 31st.

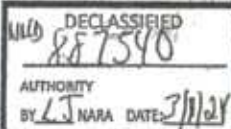

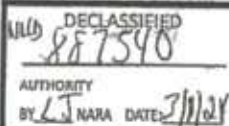

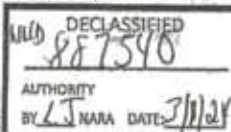

C O M P A N Y - H I S T O R Y

The 1790th Ordnance Supply and Maintenance Company, (Aviation) was activated 1 Nov 1942, at Dale Mabry Field, Tallahassee, Florida. It was designated as the 1790th Ord Co MM Avn (Q) at the date of its activation. It was re-designated as the 1790th Ord S&M Co (Avn) on 1 May 1943, per par 1, GO #25, Hq WRASC, Robins Field, Warner Robins, Georgia, dated 28 April 1943. Its authorized table of organization is T/O 9-417, dated 29 Sept 1943.

Prior to its re-designation, the unit was part of the Ordnance Training Center at Dale Mabry Field. Ordnance men received training as automotive mechanics at this training center.

After its re-designation, an ammunition section, an armament section, and a technical supply section were added to the unit.

On the 14th of June 1943, the unit conveyed by government vehicle to Mac Dill Field, Tampa, Florida, for temporary duty. The unit remained at Mac Dill Field until 15 July 1943, on which date it returned to Dale Mabry Field. While at Mac Dill Field, the unit obtained training in maintenance of automotive equipment, aircraft armament, small arms, and the storage and handling of ammunition.

On the 17th of July 1943, the unit marched to Cyprus Lake and set up camp. Much needed training, necessary for operations under field conditions was derived from this bivouac. The unit returned to Dale Mabry Field on the 24th of July 1943. The unit spent 12 more days, from 17 Sept to 28 Sept 1943, on bivouac at Cyprus Lake for additional training.

The unit left Dale Mabry Field at 1300hrs, 4 Dec 1943. It arrived at Camp Shanks, New York, after a trip by rail, at 1500hrs, 6 Dec 1943. The organization immediately underwent processing for overseas shipment.

We left Camp Shanks at 1700hrs 11 Dec 1943, and after a short trip by rail, upon reaching our destination, we boarded ship. The strength of the unit at embarkation was 4 officers and 76 enlisted men.

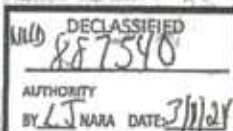
On the 19th of December 1943, after quite a trip across the Atlantic Ocean, we arrived in Scotland. The land looked very good to everyone, especially those of us who were affected by sea sickness.

We left the ship on the 21st of Dec 1943, and boarded a train. We arrived the next day at 1000hrs at AAF Station 130. We took up quarters there, and also ate the first good meal since we left the States.

Our sections started to build their shops. The Automotive Maintenance Section built its garage in the Tech Site, The Supply & Armament Sections also built their shops in the Tech Site. The Ammunition Section began improving the Bomb Dump.

The damp climate was very good for breeding colds. Most of us got a cold, and kept it for quite some time. On the 4th of January 1944, T/5th Harry Polay was admitted to sick quarters with a bad cold. He left the next day for duty, but T/5th Anton C. Johnson and Pfc John L. Thornburgh took his place. On the 6th of January 1944, Thornburgh left the Infirmary for duty, and Johnson re-joined us on the 8th of January 1944.

On the 9th of January 1944, 2nd Lt Veryl D. Sturdevant left for No 1 Bomb Disposal Gp, Royal Engineer Tng Wg. Duke of Yorks Hq. London to study Bomb Reconnaissance.



The morale department is beginning to function again. Our mail is starting to get here from the States.

Lt Sturdevant returned from Bomb Reconnaissance School on the 16th of January. On the same day, T/4th Palmy S. Matragrano left for a course of one week duration on Browning Vickers Machine Guns, and Pfc John J. Roberts left for a 2 weeks course on B-17 Armament. The School was #10 School of Technical Training at RAF Station Kirkham.

On the 17th of January 1944, Sgt Donald J. Harris left for Bomb Reconnaissance School at AAF Station Cheddington.

The 22nd of January found T/4th Matragrano back from school, and the following day marked the return of Sgt Harris.

On the 30th of January, 1st Lt Kenneth J. Burke left for #1 Bomb Disposal Gp, Royal Engineer Training Wing, Duke of Yorks Hq, London to study Bomb Reconnaissance. T/4th Clarence A. Deverwaere left for B-17 Armament School at RAF Sta Kirkham, and Pfc Robert H. Dutmers left for Ammunition School at AAF Sta 521. Pfc Roberts returned to duty from B-17 Armament Sch.

T/5th Alfred B. Kenny left for Bomb Reconnaissance School at AAF Sta Cheddington on the 31st of January.

On the 2nd of February T/Sgt Leo U. Mazzone was killed by an accident. He was struck by a truck while he was riding a bicycle. The entire unit mourned his death.

On the 16th of February, Lt Burke, T/5th Kenny, and Pfc Dutmers returned from school. Sgt Lyle H. Eagan left for B-17 Armament School at #10 School of Technical Training at RAF Station Kirkham on the 16th of February.

T/5th John J. Carey left for Bomb Reconnaissance School at AAF Station Cheddington on the 7th of February.

On the 11th of February 1st Lt Ernest H. Behrens and 1st Lt Herbert B. McClanahan, and 4 enlisted men were attached to this unit to instruct the Ammunition men of this unit and of the Bomb Squadrons.

On the 12th of February, T/4th Deverwaere returned from B-17 Armament School.

On the 13th of February, T/5th Carey returned from Bomb Reconnaissance School.

Pfc Jerry W. Bird left for RAF Station Kirkham for a 7 day course on Vehicle Waterproofing.

On the 20th of February, Pfc Roberts became a Corporal, and Pvt Matthew W. Byrnes was promoted to Pfc. Sgt Eagan returned from B-17 Armament Sch.

Pfc Bird returned from Waterproofing School on the 24th of February.

On the 25th of February, the 4 enlisted men who were attached to this unit returned to their proper station. 1st Lt McClanahan also left.

Pfc Herbert H. Mason left for #8 School of Technical Training at RAF Station Weston to receive a course in Tire Maintenance of one week duration. He left for school on the 8th of March. On the 15th of March he returned to duty.

On the 18th of March, Cpl Roberts was promoted to the rank of Sgt.

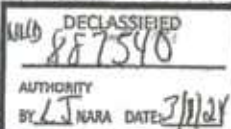
On the 29th of March, Pvt James E. Everhart left for a course on Waterproofing at #8 School of Technical Training at RAF Station Weston.

During the month, the Armament Section repaired 356 Cal .50 Machine Guns, 10 shot guns, 20 Carbines, Cal .30M1, 15 rifles Cal .30 M1903, and 3 sub machine guns Cal .45. Mounts for Cal .30 machine guns were constructed and installed in 5 British Armored Vehicles for the Station Defense Squad. All Aircraft weapons of the 748, 749, 750, and 751st Bomb Squadrons received bi-monthly inspections.

The Ammunition Section received and stored 1158 tons of bombs and their components. During the month, 1427 tons of bombs were issued to the Squadrons. 151 (2 1/2 ton truck) loads of salvage were sent back to the Depot.

On the 4th of September, Sgt Donald J. Harris was transferred to the 750th Bomb Squadron from the Ammunition Section. Pvt William H. Stegall was assigned to this unit from the 750th Bomb Squadron. Pvt Stegall is a munitions worker.

On the 28th of September, Pvt Harvey H. Pollack was transferred from this unit to the 2100th Eng Avn F/P Platoon.

On the 28th of October, Pvt James E. Everhart left for a course at Cletrac Maintenance School, AAF Station 158.

The unit strength on the 31st of October 1944 was 4 Officers and 75 Enlisted Men.

During the month of October the Automotive Repair Shop took in 174 vehicles of this base to repair. One hundred sixty-four of these jobs were completed by the end of the month.

The Ammunition Section received, maintained, and stored 972 tons of bombs during the month. 896 tons of bombs were expended on missions. Approximately 8 days were spent grinding down Navy Bombs and drilling fuzes for these bombs. During the month, 80 loads of salvage were sent back to the Depot.

The Armament Section cleaned and repaired 297 weapons of all types for the units of this base. The section inspected all A/C weapons of the 748, 749, 750, and 751st Bomb Squadrons. The organizational weapons of the 1790th Ord S&M Co (Avn) and the 748th Bomb Squadron were inspected during October.

The Technical Supply Section received and issued all parts for the repair and maintenance of all weapons and vehicles of this base. This section replaced flak suits for 22 aircraft and also salvaged 12 bicycles at the depot.

The unit strength on the 1st of November 1944 was 4 Officers and 75 Enlisted Men.

T/5th Anton C. Johnson was transferred to the 1402nd AAF Air Base Unit, AAF Station 112, on the 3rd of November.

The unit strength on the 30th of November was 4 Officers and 74 Enlisted Men.

The Automotive Section took in 261 vehicles for maintenance and repair. The section completed 242 of these jobs by the end of the month.

The Ammunition Section received and stored 2661 tons of all types of bombs during the month. It issued 2394 tons of bombs to the Squadrons.

The section also received and issued all flares, signal cartridges, clay pigeons, and shotgun shells. 70 loads of salvage were returned to Station 583.

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In November the Armament Section inspected Unit weapons of the 88th Station Compliment Squadron, 860th Chemical Co, 1212th QM Co, 1790th Ord Co, 750th Bomb Squadron, and 751st Bomb Squadron, also the a/c weapons of the 748th Bomb Squadron and 749th Bomb Squadron (H). The carbines of the 1790th Ord Co were modified. 195 machine guns Cal .50 were cleaned and repaired. 150 pistols were cleaned and shipped.

The Tech Supply Section replaced 12 a/c flack suits. Repaired 50 watches, and parts were precured to take 9 vehicles off deadline.
