# Elections Completed at 2024 Annual Meeting

The 2024 Reunion and Annual Membership Meeting was held in conjunction with the meetings of the 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force Historical Society on September 25-29 in New Orleans. The membership meeting and elections were held on Friday morning, the 27<sup>th</sup>, and attendance was made available by electronic means for those members who could not attend in person. Following a summary of the year's activities by the officers and board of directors, presented by President Eric D. Zemper, the primary order of business was addressed: elections for two officers and two board positions.

As required by our Bylaws, a nominating committee was appointed to solicit nominations for the positions of president and secretary, which are elected in even-numbered years for two-year terms, and for two board positions. Normally, only one of the four board positions is elected each year but, with the passing of Gregg Robertson, the remaining three years of his term must be filled at the next annual meeting. After calling for nominations in the May newsletter, by email and by postings on the website, the nominations committee received (continued on page 2)

only one nomination for each of the four positions: President – Eric D. Zemper (incumbent); Secretary – Lynda Thomas (incumbent, appointed by board to fill a vacancy); 3-year board term – Dorothy Enriquez (incumbent, appointed by board to fill a vacancy); 4-year board term – Eric J. Zemper. (The incumbent in the 4-year board term was Kurt Gunderson, who chose not to seek re-election for another term,) President Zemper made one final call for nominations from the floor and, hearing none, the slate of nominees from the Nominations Committee was elected by acclamation. President Zemper, on behalf of the Association, acknowledged and thanked Kurt Gunderson for his several years of service on the board. Zemper then welcomed his son as a new member of the board.

A moment of silence was observed in their honor and memory.

There was a brief discussion of when to schedule the next Association tour to Glatton and the UK. The board had previously decided to use the tour group that had arranged last year's tour, and that the next tour should be in 2026 or 2027. Whether the tour should take place in May (for Memorial Day) or in August/September was discussed, and it was decided to seek further input from the membership (see note on page 3).

As noted by President Zemper, next year's annual meeting will be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force Historical Society in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on October 1-5, 2025. The 2026 meeting will be held at the Mighty 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force Museum in Pooler, Georgia, just outside of Savannah.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned. (Minutes of the meeting were emailed to all members for whom we have email addresses,)

Along with the new organizational documents came the decision to hold our annual stateside meetings in conjunction with the 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force Historical Society, which relieves our Association of the time and expense of doing all the planning and logistical work for each year's meeting. Closely related to that was the decision by the board to hire a tour group to arrange our successful visit to Glatton and the UK last year, thus saving us much additional cost and effort. Operating under the new Bylaws, we now are having quarterly board meetings, taking advantage of the availability of electronic means of meeting together to discuss Association business. We have adopted a formal annual budget, and have been actively reminding people to pay their annual dues and soliciting donations, which are the two primary sources of income for paying for our operations. We've been providing active support to Erwin de Mooij in his work maintaining and expanding our website, which has been gaining a reputation as one of the largest and most informative of any of the bomb group websites. And at the suggestion of my son, Eric J. Zemper, who now is a newly elected board member, we are developing a virtual museum of 457<sup>th</sup> artifacts and publishing a high quality coffee table-style book of 457<sup>th</sup> BG photographs.

So, I believe it's been a productive couple of years for our Association, and I look forward to our journey ahead. Finally, please take a moment on Monday, November 11, to remember our veterans, past and present.

# What's Your Preference?

We have decided to plan a tour every three to four years, which means the next one would be in 2026 or 2027. Everyone was pleased with the arrangements made by the tour group that worked with us last year, so we likely will use that organization again. A major question is whether we should plan to go in late May, for the Memorial Day celebrations in the UK, or in August or September, as we did last year. The advantage of going in late May is being able to take part in the impressive Memorial Day ceremonies, primarily at the American Military Cemetery at Madingley. The disadvantage is that the weather often is not the best at that time of year. The primary advantage of going in August or September is that the weather is usually quite nice at that time of year; but, of course, we won't have the memorial ceremonies to attend.

Still having time to consider things before we have to make a decision, the board would like to solicit input from the membership. If you have any thoughts of possibly joining the tour to see the Glatton airfield where the 457<sup>th</sup> BG was based, and many other interesting sights in the UK, **please let us know your preferences (2026 or 2027? Late May or August/September? Any other thoughts or suggestions?).** We probably will need a minimum of 15 participants in the tour (last year we had 17).

## IN MEMORIAM





**George E. Parker** October 21, 2024 (99 years old)
College Station, TX

LT George Parker was a co-pilot in the 748<sup>th</sup> Bomber Squadron. He flew 17 missions, starting two weeks after his 20<sup>th</sup> birthday at the end of February 1945, through the 457<sup>th</sup>'s last mission in April of 1945. On two missions George had to help get his badly damaged aircraft back to Glatton. He is the father of 457<sup>th</sup> BGA Vice President Robert Parker.





**Albert G. Williams** September 24, 2023 (101 years old) St. Clair Shores, MI

TSGT Albert Williams was an engineer and top-turret gunner in the 751<sup>st</sup> Bomber Squadron. Williams' plane was shot down over Erfurt, Germany, on November 20, 1944. After bailing out, he was captured and spent six months in Stalag Luft I, then liberated in May 1945 by Russian soldiers. His book entitled 'Falling Down for the Count' chronicles his experiences in the war and as a POW.

**Gregg Robertson** December 2023 (79 years old) Kailua, Hawaii

Gregg was a board member of the 457<sup>th</sup> BG Association, serving alongside his wife Trisha Mach Robertson, who passed away a year earlier. Trisha was the daughter and Gregg was the son-in-law of TSGT Bill Mach, a member of the Photo Section of the 457<sup>th</sup> BG.
